ASQG Christmas Quilt Block Exchange Starting Up

Make a Christmas or holiday block of your choice.

It can be pieced or appliqued, but it should measure $12\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished (12" finished). The exchange will take place at our December meeting and a prize will be awarded for the best block.

For the exchange, take a small piece of white or unbleached muslin, iron it to a piece of freezer paper for stability and attach it to a seam on the BACK side of the block. On this label, you will write:

Made by: your name

Received by: (and the year) 2023

Wrap the block around a paper towel tube and cover with wrapping paper.

If you bring a block you may pick one up from the basket. After the blocks are opened and the recipient's name is printed on the back, these will be collected, hung and judged by the membership present. A prize will be awarded for the best block. You will then get to take your gift block home.

If you bring two blocks, you can keep one and trade one.

IN a few years, you will have enough blocks for a Christmas/Holiday quilt.

WOW!!! It hardly seems like we have almost come to the end of ASQG Challenge 2023! The November 2nd guild meeting is the day to turn in your masterpieces of the Doorway Challenge, which is sponsored by the guild's Applique Group.

If you haven't started yet, here is the basic information.

- The theme is "Doorways"
- It should be 20" wide, any length up to 30"
- It needs to be quilted and finished with binding and a 4" sleeve on the upper back side.
- Your "Doorway" may be imaginary, a real location, a literary feature, a fantasy/idea, or a geographical feature. BE CREATIVE!!!

A few members of the ASQG Applique group will be collecting the pieces at the November guild meeting. Your masterpieces will be well taken care of while in our possession.

Please put a label on the back, with your name and phone number. The label can be inked, written, sewn, pinned, made of cloth or paper. If you wish to enclose your piece in a pillowcase or plastic bag, please make sure it is also labeled with your name and phone number.

The pieces will be returned to the makers after the December guild meeting, where they will be displayed for members to vote for their favorite. You will be asked to put a more permanent label on when entering it in Quilt Show 2024.


