Quilt Show 2024

At Least One Quilt from each ASQG member for the Quilt show!

We are Four months from our quilt show. Quilt Registration is open. The July Guild newsletter contains the registration documents. You can download the documents from the asqg.org website. Quilt Registration documents will be available at the Aug. guild meeting.

The next quilt show meeting is July 30, 6:30 p.m. at Cindy Needham's Studio on Mangrove.

The quilt show meetings are open to all interested guild members. You do not have to be on a quilt show committee to attend. So come observe, learn what it is all about!

The August 1st guild meeting starts the volunteer sign-ups for working the ASQG committee spaces present at the quilt show. The committee chairs will be present at the sign-up table to answer any questions you may have about the committee they chair. Not only is working the quilt show fun you get free admission to the quilt show after your shift to browse and shop. The typical work shift is two hours. Join in!

The committees that will be asking for volunteers are:

<u>Admissions</u>: Volunteers will greet guests, sell admission tickets, attach wristbands, distribute programs, and answer questions regarding the quilt show.

Annie's Attic: The flea market of gently used quilting related items. Volunteers assist our guests at checkout, keep the items for sale stocked and neat. The first shift of Annie's on Saturday is a lively place.

<u>Boutique</u>: New items made by our members for sale to our guests at the show. Volunteers assist guests at checkout and keep the items for sale well stocked and tidy.

<u>Community Service</u>: Guild members are onsite to answer questions from our guests about Annie's Star Quilt Guild and our ongoing commitment to our community.

<u>Decorations</u>: A small group that will decorate the education building on the Friday afternoon prior to the quilt show. On Sunday, after the show closes, the group will reform to remove the decorations.

Elder liaison: A small group will be on hand on Saturday morning prior to the opening of our quilt show to the public. They will shepherd guests from our local assisted living establishments through our quilt show.

<u>Fat Quarter Towers</u>: Member volunteers sell tickets to guests for the opportunity to win the 'towers' of fabric.

<u>Food Court</u>: Volunteers will keep the food court area neat and tidy. This also involves managing the trash cans at the venue.

<u>Pick-a-Prize</u>: Sell tickets to guests for the opportunity to win one of beautiful baskets of goodies.

<u>Vendors</u>: Volunteer members will be helping hands as needed. We offer bottled water and snacks to our vendors. Offer a coffee run to the lovely layers truck on the patio. Assist the vendors with their lunch orders on Saturday and Sunday.

Quilt Registration: Volunteers work on Friday morning prior to the quilt shot to receive and process our members' quilts for placement in the quilt show. On Sunday, after the show closes the group reforms to distribute the quilts back to the members.

Setup/Takedown: Member volunteers will work in teams for approx. 4 hours to put up the quilts on the Friday morning prior to the show. On Sunday after the quilt show closes the groups will reform and take the quilts down. Approximately thirty members are needed. We will have students on hand to assist our members as well. This is a physically demanding committee.



QUILT REGISTRATION DEADLINE: THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 5th, 2024

Quilt Registration Forms: Quilt Registration forms are available in the ASQG newsletter, at the July and at the August General Meetings. Note: A separate form is required for each quilt being submitted.

Master or Artisan: To determine Master or Artisan classification refer to the chart on the back.

Qui	ilt Category Definitions:
App	olique:
•	 ☐ Hand Applique: More than 50% of the work in these quilts is hand applique. ☐ Machine Applique: In these quilts, more than 50% is machine applique work.
Art	 These quilts are non-traditional in form and composition. They may include embellishments and elements other than fabric. Examples of these quilts are landscapes. collages, etc. The design for this quilt is the exhibitor's original work. The design for this quilt was created by someone other than the exhibitor.
	Group/Challenge: Three or more individuals have made these quilts. Examples are round robin, progressive or challenge quilts as well as small group projects. The intent is to display them together.
	Hand Embroidery: Hand embroidery appears in more than 50% of these quilts.
	Innovative: In these quilts, traditional blocks have been modified by different techniques including but not limited to having different angles, curves, off-kilter piecing, or 3-D in appearance, etc.
	Mixed (Applique and Pieced)
	Pieced: More than 50% of these quilts are made up of recognizable traditional blocks. Other: Other includes wool, whole cloth, stenciled, stamped, painted, machine embroidery, and kits.





On four large yellow sqs: snowball a 2 1/2 i turquoise on one corner


On four large turquoise sqs: snowball a 2 1/2 yellow on one corner
