



Newsletter Block

Due at our August Meeting

Two pieces of fabric: one mostly black and one mostly white

Cut these pieces 9-1/2" square

Place <u>both</u> RIGHT SIDES UP, one on top of the other.



Align these squares and both pieces.

make a diagonal cut across

Cut a bright piece of solid

fabric 1-1/2" x 12".

Sew one of these in between one white and one black piece of fabric.





You will have 2 blocks. Square up to 9" x 9
