

With the New Year – yes, I realize I'm repeating this New Year theme – there are a couple of things I'd like members to be thinking about.

First of all, our opportunity quilt is going to be traveling to other guilds, and our boutique will go along with it to some events. We will be asking for volunteers to help transport these items and work at our booths. Let's not leave that up to the core members who typically do the work. Please consider helping out, as these sales provide funds for our Guild expenses, such as engaging great presenters and paying for a comfortable meeting venue.

Secondly, please start thinking about our next opportunity quilt. Our current quilt will be given to the winning raffle ticket holder at the quilt show in November, and we will want a new one to be ready by January 2027. So, we have a year to plan and create something awesome. This would be a committee project, of course, so I am looking for someone to coordinate it. Short of that, let's all start considering potential patterns and batting around ideas for it. Send me any thoughts you may have on it.

## Workshops

Jo Schreiber & Frieda White, workshop co-chairs

Annie's Star Quilt Guild has an exciting array of workshops coming up.

On Friday, February 6 learn or perfect your skills at paper piecing on a very small scale. Linda Wagner will be teaching "Minis Your Way," a class using her method to paper piece mini quilts on a printed muslin pattern. The class will be at Honey Run Quilters starting at 10 a.m.

In March, Diana Karna will instruct on how to make a beautiful, well fitted quilted coat. Participants can either obtain a pattern to make patchwork designs for the coat or start with a finished quilt or quilted fabric. The workshop is a day and a half. 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. on Friday, March 6 and 9 a.m. – noon on Saturday, March 7 at The Sew Mates Studio. Note there is an additional \$30 fee for the required pattern. April brings us returning workshop instructor Karen Bolan. In her workshop "Jacks" participants will learn or perfect making continuous Y seams and partial seams and come home with a mini quilt/wall hanging made as a variation of the "Jacks Chain" pattern. 

Hopefully you finished all of your holiday projects. Boutique venues and the Farmer's Market (Yes, we are back) begin this spring. So think



Each of our *recipient organizations* have a Guild member that acts as the “liaison” between them and our Guild. This member is responsible for contacting the organization periodically (monthly, quarterly, semi-annually, or annually) to discuss and confirm their “needs and wishes.”

- What items do they need/want?
- How many items per month/year?
- How can we best meet their needs?
- Do they have any suggestions or questions regarding our donations?

We volunteer our time, expertise and efforts to serve our community. It isn't as simple as making the items and then giving them away. There are several steps involved in order for our efforts to succeed. Following are the “duties” and “responsibilities” of the Community Service Chair: Report to the membership at the General meetings and the Board meetings.

- Maintain the donation distribution records.
- Maintain the annual budget.
- Assemble the quilt kits and over-see their distribution to the membership willing to piece, quilt and bind.
- Assemble the other “kits” and gather materials, include/write directions, package for distribution to members.
- Cut
- Sew
- Quilt

- Bind
- Attach labels
- Remove threads
- Wash and iron
- Repackage into clean, sealed bags
- Receive completed items at the general meetings
- Count, sort, check quality of product as well as packaging
- Complete the distribution forms and any other forms required. Make sure the forms are signed, dated and turned into the member keeping the records, in a timely fashion.
- Arrange to have the donated items delivered to the organization.
- Receive donated fabrics and other materials, sort the fabrics and integrate into the “stash.” Write thank you notes for donations.
- Maintain the “stash.” Keep it organized. Schedule work days, contact members to assist. Send out blasts to the membership when “work” days are planned.
- Respond to questions from our website and/or send to appropriate member to deal with. These are usually forwarded by Laura, our member/web master.
- Be in charge of monthly sew days. This means scheduling the classroom, sending out reminder blasts to the membership, attending, and possibly having ideas and projects for members to work on.

A flow chart previously handed out at the Guild meeting lists the members that are responsible for many of the duties listed above. As you can see, there are many things for the Community Service Chair to keep track of. Currently Dorothy Van Pelt is the designated member serving as the Assistant CS Chair.

Perhaps we should consider having 3-4 members to serve jointly as heads of CS. It is not my belief or intention that the next person do exactly as I have done. Maybe it is time for new ideas and a new view at how things are done. I am willing to spend the remainder of my term training anyone that is interested in taking over this committee. It has been my pleasure to serve as your Community Service Chair for the last 6 years.



# Newsletter Block: The Double Fourpatch

Due at March meeting



The Double Fourpatch is a 16-1/2" unfinished block. The **A squares should be a batik**, the **B four patches should be black and white**, the **C rectangles should be white**. It will go together easily and quickly... make 2!!
