



Newsletter Block: Charming Spring

Jeanne Haber, Newsletter Block

Due at the March meeting.

This block works well with 5 in charm squares in small flower prints.

The strips are white, cut at 1-1/2 in. Block is 5-1/2 in finished.

The 5 in. (charm) is cut in half, insert 1-1/2 in \times 5 in white strip, then cut that block in half and insert 1-1/2 \times 5-1/2 in white strip to create finished block.

Blocks will make a 'charming' spring quilt! All the blocks together will look like a flower garden.
