#### ASQG Christmas Quilt Block Exchange

Make a Christmas or holiday block of your choice. It can be pieced or appliqued, but it should measure 12  $^{1}/_{2}$ " unfinished (12" finished). The exchange will take place at our December meeting and a prize will be awarded for the best block. For the exchange, take a small piece of white or unbleached muslin, iron it to a piece of freezer paper for stability and attach it to a seam on the BACK side of the block.

On this label, you will write:

Made by: your name

Received by: \_\_\_\_\_ (and the year) 2024.

Wrap the block around a paper towel tube and cover with wrapping paper. If you bring a block you may pick one up from the basket. After the blocks are opened and the recipient's name is printed on the back, these will be collected, hung and judged by the membership present. A prize will be awarded for the best block. You will then get to take your gift block home. If you bring two blocks, you can keep one and trade one. In a few years, you will have enough blocks for a holiday Christmas quilt.


