A big thank you to the Applique Small Group for presenting at the October meeting. It was wonderful seeing all the amazing quilts!



ASQG Christmas Quilt Block Exchange

Make a Christmas or holiday block of your choice. It can be pieced or appliqued, but it should measure 12 \(^1/^2\) unfinished (12" finished). The exchange will take place at our December meeting and a prize will be awarded for the best block. For the exchange, take a small piece of white or unbleached muslin, iron it to a piece of freezer paper for stability and attach it to a seam on the BACK side of the block.

On this label, you will write:

Made by: your name

Received by: _____ (and the year) 2024.

Wrap the block around a paper towel tube and cover with wrapping paper. If you bring a block you may pick one up from the basket. After the blocks are opened and the recipient's name is printed on the back, these will be collected, hung and judged by the membership present. A prize will be awarded for the best block. You will then get to take your gift block home. If you bring two blocks, you can keep one and trade one. In a few years, you will have enough blocks for a holiday Christmas quilt.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

Kelly gave a brief overview of the meeting that will focus on the coming Quilt Show.

OLD BUSINESS:

- 1) Open Committees:
- a) Opportunity Quilt: We do not have a committee chair for the Opportunity Quilt Committee. Kelly will book guilds to attend with their Opportunity Quilts. A chairperson is needed to plan the 2025-2026 Opportunity Quilt and to be responsible to travel to other guilds and events with the Opportunity Quilt.
- b) Property Manager:

Kelly gave a brief description of the duties for a Property Manager Chairperson. Please speak to Kelly if you are interested in volunteering for this position.

There are 73 members enrolled and dues paid at the end of September.

From complementary fabric for sashings, cut two pieces 2-1/2" by 6-1/2" and two pieces 2-1/2" by 10-1/2"

Sew the two smaller pieces to the top and bottom of your Christmas square and the two larger pieces to the sides.
