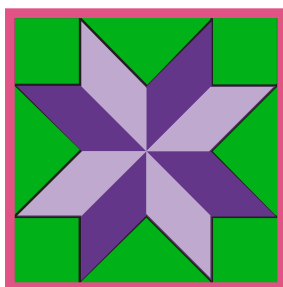

In her workshop “Jacks” participants will learn or perfect making continuous Y seams and partial seams, and come home with a mini quilt/wall hanging made as a variation of the “Jacks Chain” pattern. This workshop will be taught on Friday, April 3 at Honey Run Quilters starting at 10 a.m. Her website is Karenbolan.com.

On Friday, May 8 we are excited to have our own Kathy Thomas to teach her workshop “Creating Fiber Art Using Water Soluble Stabilizer.”

In this workshop, participants will use fibers such as bits of fabric, ribbons, roving yarns, decorative trims and thread with water soluble stabilizer to create unique art quilts. Kathy will have kits available for \$10.

The workshop will be held at Honey Run Quilters from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

In September, nationally known quilter Dana Jones will be here to teach a workshop.

Workshop Fees are \$45. for guild members, \$50. for non-members. Contact Jo Schrieber or Frieda White for more information.



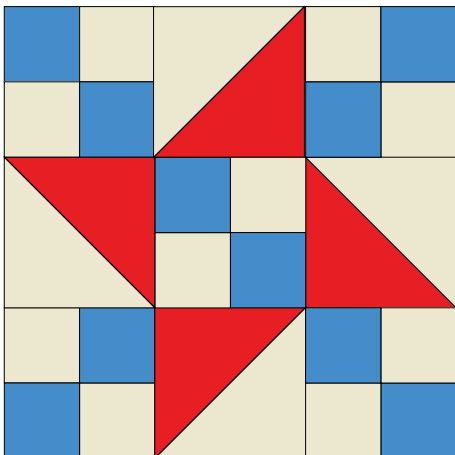

Bring your own projects to work on, and all you need to work on them. The chairs are metal and uncomfortable, so you may wish to bring your own chair or a nice cushion. There are a lot of outlets, but if you are a bit away from the wall, you might need a power strip or short extension cord. There are no cutting mats there, but there are irons/ironing boards available.

In April our sew day is April 16th on a Thursday.

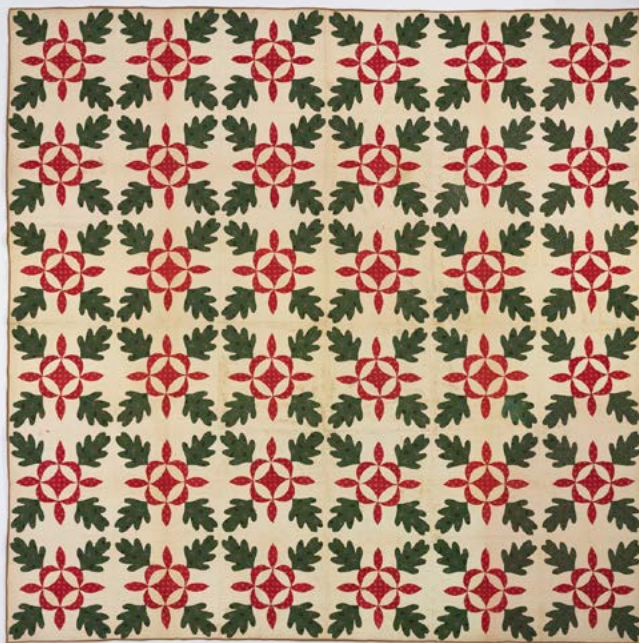
