A Message From The California Heritage Quilt Project

The California Heritage Quilt Project is excited to announce that we have begun the digitization of the California Heritage Quilt Project Documentation/Quilt Days that were held between 1984 and 1986. These holdings consist of over 3,000 thousand individual California quilts that were documented both on paper and in slide photography. This was done over 32 quilt days in 2 years, hosted by local guilds and museums across Northern and Southern California. Their purpose was to find the most historic quilts and present them in a book written by Jean Ray Laury. The book was completed in 1990, the records were archived in 1991 at the Los Angeles County Museum of Art as part of the American Quilt Research Center under guest curator and writer Sandi Fox.

Until the recent revival of the California Heritage Quilt Project in January 2022, these archives containing CHQPs organizing documents, the quilt days registrations and slides, materials relative to Ho For California! Pioneer Women and Their Quilts, have been in deep storage since the early 2000's. CHQP has established good contacts and have been working closely with LACMA in developing a plan for digitization. The records are now permanently at the Balch Art Research Library at LACMA. Appointments are needed to look at the records, but they no longer have to come from deep storage. This is a huge step in making the records available.

Phase 1 of this effort was to determine if the 6000+ slides were viable for converting to jpgs so we have a photo/s of each quilt registered, we now know this is possible and have committed funds to having these photos converted.

Phase 2 will entail scanning all the folders of

registration forms, then matching to the new jpgs for our electronic database. CHQP needs to know and have record of what California quilts have been registered under the project and LACMA would like a more comprehensive Finding Guide (developed in 2006), we are working together to achieve this.

Phase 3 will entail entering these quilts into the Quilt Index as part of the California Heritage Quilt Project.

Digitizing is an expensive endeavor, but our enthusiastic supporters have helped to raise more than half the funds needed to complete the image digitization, we need to reach out and ask for any support in donations that can be made. To date, we have been the benefactor of many guilds where we have presented, American Quilt Study Group - Lucy Hilty Grant 2023, individual donors' enormous generosity, local quilt history groups like Repiecers.

CHQP is committed to preserving California's past, present, and future quilt history. With your help, we can make quilt research accessible to everyone.

On June 5, 1985, the CHQP Quilt Day was hosted in Chico by Marian Graham and Pam Herman, with 219 quilts documented.


