
The new meeting order will be as follows:



It's that time again, wonderful guild members. The bins are ready and the tables are waiting as we begin preparations for our annual Annie's Attic Rummage Sale. This year, our beloved guild tradition returns to the Quilt show.

As any maker knows, a well-loved sewing room can quickly overflow. Annie's Attic is the perfect opportunity to "destash" your high-quality supplies, knowing they will go to a fellow enthusiast who will treasure them. To make this our most successful year yet, we are inviting all members to begin gathering their donations for our first collection window starting at the March Guild Meeting.

A Focused Collection: Sewing & Quilting

To ensure the high quality our shoppers expect, we are strictly focusing on sewing and quilting supplies. We want our "Annie's Attic" to be the highlight of the event (aside from the quilts, of course)!

The "Yes" List:

- Quality Fabrics: Neatly folded yardage of cotton, wool, silk, or knits.
- Pre-cuts: Jelly rolls, layer cakes, fat quarters, and charm packs.
- The Maker's Toolkit: Rotary cutters, acrylic rulers, and sharp shears.
- Notions & Bits: Unopened thread, zippers, vintage buttons, and project kits.

The "No" List:

To keep our sorting process manageable, please skip any fabric scraps smaller than a fat eighth (9" x 22"). We also cannot accept books, magazines, or broken tools. Finally, please ensure all textiles are clean and odor-free; if it isn't something you'd be excited to receive in your own sewing room, it's likely best to pass.

Drop-off Details

Collection begins this March at our regular guild meeting. We are also hard at work securing a second drop-off location to make donating even easier—stay tuned for that announcement coming soon!

Community Service Meeting Report

DATE OF MEETING: January 31, 2026 ATTENDANCE: 22 members

Service Organization Updates, Existing

- Kathy had asked the Service Organization Leaders to contact their respective organizations to get an idea for what their 2026 needs will be. This is a work in progress.
 - » It was also discussed that the request for this information should go out earlier than the beginning of the year, so we are better able to prepare.
- Butte County Foster Youth -
 - » It was decided that we should add a pillowcase with the quilt being provided for kids ageing out.
 - » We should check to see if they want pillowcases in general.
- Butte Humane Society -
 - » does not want any more large dog beds – still want the smaller pads 2-3 layers of batting
 - » do need someone to serge towels that are cut into smaller pieces. Kristi Williamson & Karen (sorry don't remember last name) have volunteered to work with the animal shelters. Kristi currently makes dog coats and various things and donates them to the Chico Animal Shelter. They are going to reach out to Chico Animal Shelter to see if they can use any dog beds.
- Catalyst –
 - » Valerie Capp said she will take charge and she will contact Anastasia.
- Enloe Medical Center -
 - » Hold on providing them with any more pillowcases.
 - » They still want adult hearts and fidget quilts, as many as can be provided.
 - » Diane Fritter – has requested to only be involved in making the heart kits.
- Esplanade House –
 - » TBD
- Everheart Village -
 - » TBD
- Jesus Center -
 - » Need 12 quilts (twin sizes) for the three housing units (female, male, & family) = 36 total. I believe they already received 32.
 - » They wash them weekly.
 - » UPDATE: With help from Suzanne Steele, Carol Jemison delivered 41 quilts to the Jesus Center on February 6th.
- Meals on Wheels
 - » For 2026, they have requested 15 placemats per month and 100 placemats for Christmas time.
- North Valley Catholic Social Services
 - » TBD
- Peg Taylor –
 - » we need to reach out to see if they need anything
- Salvation Army - Women's Rehab –
 - » TBD
- Sutter Medical Center -
 - » Per Cinnamon, they are willing to take anything we send, including small quilts and pillowcases

- » Dolls and Bean bags are still on hold.

Service Organizations, New

- There were several new service organizations suggested, which need Board approval -
 - » Casa
 - » Chico Animal Shelter
 - » Project Linus
 - » Project SAVE
- UPDATE: Approval for above organizations received from the Board on 2-12-26

Community Service Other Updates

- Jane Edelstein -
 - » would like to make adult bibs (neck napkins) for the people in skilled nursing facilities. She already received confirmation that these were made and donated before. She has received fabric from Kathy and will make up a few as examples. She will also create kits and head up the committee.
 - » She is also involved with Project Save - if we have any 3-yard pieces in the Stash to get rid of she will take them.
- Fidget blankets -
 - » Valerie said she needs trinkets. She will send an email outlining what types of things she needs.
- Quilt Size Discussion -
 - » It was decided the maximum size quilt we should be making is a Twin size (70" x 90").
 - » The kit sizes we put together will be for youth twin/single or twin XL
 - » Also, we need to make more men's / boy's quilts
 - » It was noted that we often use Villa Rosa patterns, which are smaller. If needed, additional border(s) can be added to make them larger, as needed.
- Count of Quilts On-Hand -
 - » Suzanne Steele advised there were 72 quilts on hand. She also shared how she organized them in her garage.
- Orphan Blocks to Quilts -
 - » Nancy McCarthy & Linda Thomas said they would create quilts with orphan blocks.

- Children's Quilts -
 - » Nancy McCarthy volunteered to head up ANY children's quilts needs (Project Linus, etc.)
- Google Workspace Creation -
 - » Lynette Kitajima volunteered to create a Google Workspace to hold files for shared access for the Community Service Group.
 - » Examples of documents that will be maintained include an inventory for the items to be donated, the How-To / Process documents, etc.
 - » This way we can all access the information real-time.
 - » Lynette will maintain folder access and security (process to follow).
- Newsletter article -
 - » Dorothy said she would take over this task
- Stash Sorting / Organization -
 - » Melissa Maxey, Joan Hasek, Lynette Kitajima, & Cheryl Kiesel have spent many hours working on the stash.
 - » The work included cleaning up the bins and starting to sort.
 - » Melissa also started a section for Annie's Attic.
 - » The goal is to have everything sorted before the next Community Service date on February 19.
- Containers for ASQG @ Cathy's Sew & Vac / Honey Run Quilters
 - » Cheryl Kiesel contacted Cathy's and they approved letting ASQG set-up containers for Community Service drop off and pick up.
 - » It wasn't decided where the bins would be yet. Will provide an update once this decision is finalized.
 - » They also ask that they are well marked.
- Community Service Days -
 - » not everyone can stay and sew but they are still willing to participate.

It is recommended that all groups have their project kits (or supplies if you need help making kits) available at Cathy's Sew & Vac no later than 9:30 am




