Hello Guild Members,

Following is some information about our Dog/Cat Bed Program:

The dog/cat beds made by ASQG members are donated to the Butte County Humane Society.

ASQG often receives donations of heavier fabrics such as canvas, upholstery and drapery fabric that are not suitable for quilts, but are perfect for this project. You may also use your own fabrics if you desire. Once the beds are sewn, they are stuffed with bits of scrap fabric from your sewing projects. This allows us to use up our scraps instead of sending them to the landfill. A win-win.



How To Make The Dog/Cat Beds

Beds can be any size or dimension: square, rectangle, round, oval. The size needed for the crates at the Humane Society is 24" x 24". Larger beds should have sections sewn into them to prevent the "filling" from shifting too much. See example below. The "filling" scraps MUST be cut into small pieces with a rotary cutter to prevent

the beds from becoming too lumpy. Scrap fabric, batting or poly fil can be used...even old pillows. Please remember to sew "MADE BY ASQG" label onto the bed. This is easily done if you sew a second top stitch around the edge of the bed. See the example below:




