

REIN IN YOUR BRAIN: CHANGING NEUROPATHWAYS IN RECOVERY

With funding from the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA), Cynthia Moreno Tuohy worked with Danya International to conceptualize, develop, and evaluate a multi-component, multi-media tool for use by substance use, mental health and health professionals to help adults, youth and families improve their conflict resolution knowledge, attitudes and skills. This training

is an intensive set of psycho-emotional-social-spiritual Cogitative Behavioral Therapy (CBT) treatments that, if followed, will result in lifestyle changes. This program affects behavioral learning with emotional development and maturity that results in long-term changes in the brain and behavior.
