**NOTICE OF INTENT TO FILE LAWSUIT AS A RESULT OF THE
TERRIBLE RACIAL DISCRIMINATION AGAINST BLACK PEOPLE IN
THE UNITED STATES DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC**

We write with respect to the above subject matter, to give the Presidency, a formal notice of our intention to institute a legal action with regards to the recent trend of events affecting African American communities that have been unfairly treated in light of the ongoing COVID – 19 pandemic that is plaguing the world tremendously. We therefore state for record purposes the following, THAT;

1. The Blue Prince Tribal Nation, is a Non-Profit Organization which has been in existence since the year 2010. We are a Tribal Nation that serve as the voice of African Americans that are domiciled in the United States of America.
2. The African American community has been, over the centuries until today, constantly marred by instabilities and violence. Unfortunately, the COVID-19 has shown that the situation has not changed.

12. Inequities in access to health care, including inadequate health insurance, discrimination fears and distance from clinics and hospitals has made it harder for many African-Americans to access the sort of preventive care that keeps chronic diseases in check.
13. The virus has been known to take a harsher toll on those with underlying health issues, and many hospitals are only testing those admitted for critical care. That this has significantly exacerbated by racial inequities in healthcare, including facility closures and caps on public health insurance plans like Medicaid and Medicare. As a result of this inequalities, African Americans are twice as likely to lack health insurance compared with their white counterparts, and more likely to live in medically underserved areas, where primary care is sparse or expensive.
14. Lack of preventive care means that African-Americans have been more exposed than other racial groups in the United States to be hospitalized or re-hospitalized for asthma, diabetes, heart failure and post-surgery complications.
15. In the cities, like New Orleans, Chicago and Detroit, mostly domiciled by African Americans, it was reported that most African Americans have had access to limited testing as compared to their white counterparts thereby making them vulnerable.
16. According to Pew, 46% of black Americans viewed the coronavirus as a threat to their health, more than double their white counterparts.
17. At this point in the pandemic, the disparities between the size of the black population and the percentage of black people infected with, hospitalized with, or dead from COVID-19 appear to be the most severe in all the world.
18. The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) provided data that has left everyone speechless, and with a broken heart. According to the CDC analysis, the majority-black counties had infection rates three times the rate of majority-white counties, but only 10% access to care.
19. African-Americans' risk of higher exposure to COVID-19 has historical roots — including legal segregation in schools and housing, discrimination in the labor market and redlining, the practice of denying home loans to those living in predominantly African-American neighborhoods. Those forces have contributed to a persistent racial wealth gap, with African-Americans continuing to struggle to

move into neighborhoods with the sorts of socioeconomic opportunities that allow white families to better avoid exposure to COVID-19.

20. The Unfair treatment of African Americans in the wake of this COVID – 19 pandemic has breached all federal and state extant laws that prohibits racial discrimination.
21. The Unfair treatment of the African Americans in the wake of this COVID – 19 has made a proportion of African American live in fear of contracting the virus because of lack of access to Medicare as a result of segregation.
22. Failure of the Federal Government of the United States, the Senate and Congress to come to the aid of the African Americans would further ensure continuity of the untold hardship ravaging African American communities in the wake of the COVID – 19 pandemic.
23. We commend the effort of the President and the Federal Government in negotiating stimulus packages for American Citizens as the coronavirus continues to plague the United States. This show of Good faith and patriotism from the Federal Government has put a beamer of hope in the mind of African Americans that the Government can come to its aid in the wake of the COVID – 19 pandemic. Therefore, we demand from the United States Government as follows;
 - (a) To remove all bottleneck policies that are limiting African Americans from having access to medical treatment in light of this pandemic.
 - (b) That health Insurance packages be issued to all African American that would not only see them through this pandemic but for the near future.
 - (c) To promote and enact bills that will put an end to racial discrimination in the
 - (d) We respectfully request a financial support of Nineteen Billion Dollars (**\$19,000,000,000.00**) and political support for the African American communities seriously affected by coronavirus.

That while we remain optimistic as to the Federal Government's response and cooperation, we would not hesitate to hold the United State Government accountable for the death of every black American who has been unfairly treated in light of the COVID – 19 pandemic. Therefore, failure of the United State Government to act to our demands, we would not hesitate to seek proper remedy in the court of law. Thanks for your anticipated cooperation.
