#### 58 New houses completed

Hela Sarana is happy to announce that we have so far completed 58 new houses in rural remote villages in the North and East regions of Sri Lanka. When we formed Hela Sarana one of our main aims was to provide "a roof over the head" for those who could not afford it. We have achieved this aim by helping many families who lived in makeshift huts facing an uncertain future. Now they have permanent houses. We would like to express our sincere thanks for your support in raising funds for this worthy cause. We have provided not just homes but also clean drinking water (without having to walk miles to fetch it) and decent sanitary facilities, thereby improving health and hygiene.

There is land that farmers could use for cultivation if there is water. Hela Sarana helped to develop an irrigation system (see News letter Issue: No 5, November 2000- Restoration of Hinguruthanna irrigation tank, cultivation well and tanks at Pulaweli Village agro scheme and others) and encouraged farmers to cultivate the land, providing them with the opportunity to generate some income of their own. They have sufficient food and decent housing. The children attend school regularly. We achieved our aim of building striving communities at Thanthirimalaya, Nuwaragalathanne and Tampitiya.

# 15 Scholarships

Having learnt from previous experiences Hela Sarana has already decided to release more funds to provide 15 scholarships for students with financial difficulties. We have already selected one medical student, one engineering student and are in the process of selecting few more undergraduates. Additionally we have decided to sponsor further students with exceptional achievements throughout their educational programme from grade 1 to GCSE. So far we have allocated £6000 and need funds to provide more scholarships in the future. It is our fervent belief that our patriotic Sri Lankan community will continue to support in achieving our long-term vision of providing a better future for the children in under privileged communities in Sri Lanka.

Hela Sarana was founded in July 1996 by a group of friends to help the poor and the needy fellow Sri Lankans in remote villages in Sri Lanka.

Our philosophy is not to give money food or cloths for short-term benefit but to help people themselves to improve their living standard. Some villagers who lived in mud huts are now in secure homes made of bricks and mortar. We are sponsoring income generating schemes such as agricultural / cooperative farms, irrigation tanks, agricultural wells with the involvement of the local community.

Education is the key to a future, free of poverty. We believe that we can build a strong community by educating children at grass root level. Hence we utilize our resources largely on educational projects.

We are well aware of the health needs of a developing country. We have given some help to Badulla General Hospital. and are considering other health related projects for the future.

We select projects and assess them at our regular committee meetings. The projects, which benefit larger community, are given the priority. Many projects are planned to be carried out in stages and funds released according to the progress made. This way we can keep control of the project and get value for money. Administrative costs and other overheads are kept low and often met by committee members dipping in to their own pockets.

We have co-coordinators who operate locally in Sri Lanka. They are accountable for funds sent. Our members regularly visit Sri Lanka to assess the progress of our project.

We collaborate with reputable Sri Lankan organizations such as "Shastrodaya Padanama" and the Badulla "Asarana Sarana Samithiya." and use their local expertise to achieve speedy results in our projects. We have no association with political parties.

We have over 200 members to date and numbers continue to rise. The executive committee meets regularly. Last year we met 8 times. AGM was held in August.

In 2002 the Charity Commission granted us charity status. We hope to use this opportunity to improve our finances by claiming back tax paid on contributions.

Hela Sarana has organised many events not only to raise funds but also to raise the awareness of needs of the poor in Sri Lanka. Many people have given a lot of their time and effort to bring about these events. A concert featuring Pandit Amaradewa was a memorable event among these.

Our work relies on the financial support of the people like you. If you haven't joined us yet, we request you to be a part of those worthy causes by giving a contribution of £5.00 per month by standing order (larger contributions are most welcome), and become a member of Helasarana. Even a small contribution can make a big difference. We have been fortunate also to receive significant contributions from some generous supporters.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank everybody who has supported us in the past and hope that you would continue to support us in the future. You can be reassured that your contributions will help to improve the lives in Sri Lanka, now and in the future.

#### 40 GCSE students

This is another important project since our first educational programme in Thanthirimalaya. There are many poor students with great potential for higher education but cannot continue due to many reasons. Lack of opportunities, books and sheer poverty are among the reasons that prevent them entering universities (See Newsletter 5, 6 and 7 for more details). At present we have funded extra tuition classes (Science, Mathematics and English) for over 40 GCSE students.

Hela Sarana is very happy to announce that since our involvement in the educational programme, five students have been selected for universities. Most of the other students have passed the exams with excellent grades.

#### 50-Acre Agricultural Farm

This is another large project that Hela Sarana launched in 2003. The 43 permanently settled families in Thanthirimale had no regular income. Providing shelter alone was not enough. On going 50 acre agriculture project is crucial for the survival of those villagers in the long run. We planned the project to be carried in stages. The first stage of the project started in April 2003

Unfortunately the work was interrupted by heavy monsoon rains, which flooded the entire area. The work re-commenced last September and two cultivation wells were built to collect rainwater.



Hela Sarana is monitoring this pilot project. Development of the remaining 40 acres is penciled in for the future.

Presently 10 families are fully engaged in cultivating cash crops in the first 10 acres of the farmland.

### The gift of sight



Badulla "Asarana Sarana Samithiya" is a long established voluntary organization in Sri Lanka. We send Rs. 100,000/- to build an extension to the eye department to facilitate corneal grafting to enable some blind people to regain sight.

The project is now complete and patients from a wider area are now benefiting form this unit.



#### **Thalassaemia**




"Thalassaemia" is an inherited blood disorder where the patient has an abnormal form of haemoglobin. Those who suffer from this disease often have a short life span. These children need expensive daily treatments and specialised care.

Thalassaemia society in Badulla has been striving to uplift the quality of life of these forgotten children. Hela Sarana donated £500.00 to help build a day center at Badulla General Hospital for these children to have some quality time.


### Other Achievements in 2002/3

- Continuation in tuition classes in Science, Maths and English in Thanthirimalaya.


