12-18 Months Before

Create an Initial Vision

 Make an initial vision board for your wedding so that you can assess the theme and style you want.

· Set the Budget

 Determine how much you can afford and allocate funds to different aspects of the wedding.

• Look into Wedding Insurance

 Before you start paying deposits look into wedding insurance to make sure you are covered in case there are any unforeseen circumstances.

Create Vision Boards

 Create a ceremony vision board, reception vision board, table decor vision board and color palette.

Start the Guest List

• Begin drafting your guest list for the wedding and rehearsal dinner.

• Find the Venue and Pick Your Wedding Date

 Your wedding date will in most cases be dependant on the availability of your preferred venue.

• Hire a Wedding Planner (if desired)

o Consider hiring a wedding planner to assist with the planning process.

• Send Save The Dates

Choose style of your Save the Dates and let your guests know about the big day.

• Plan Engagement Party

• Choose venue, style and who you will invite to your engagement party. See the Engagement Party Planning Binder for in-depth organisational tools.

9-12 Months Before

Choose Bridal Party

• Ask your bridesmaids and groomsmen to be part of your wedding.

• Research and Book Photographer/Videographer

• Research and secure your favorite photographer/videographer.

• Book Wedding Music

• Choose whether you want a DJ or a band and secure your favorite pick.

Book Florist

• Find a florist that will match your chosen wedding style.

Secure Caterer

• Look into different types of caterers and see who would best suit your wedding.

• Book Officiant

Choose type of ceremony you would like and book your officiant.

Choose Stationary Style

• Research and pick what kind of stationary you would like for your wedding.

• Choose Wedding Decor

• Look into what wedding decor is available from your vendors and what you might want to purchase or rent.

• Order Wedding Gown

• Start shopping for and order your bridal gown.

Book Wedding Accommodations

 Book the room for your wedding night and any other accommodations you may need before or after the wedding.

• Decide on hair stylist and make up stylist for your big day.

Gift Registries

• Create and manage your gift registries.

o Organize and book venue for rehearsal dinner.

• Dress Fittings

• Attend bridal gown and bridesmaids' dress fittings.

• Order Wedding Party Gifts

• Choose gifts for your bridesmaids, groomsmen and the rest of your wedding party.

2-4 Months Before

Marriage License

Apply for and obtain your marriage license.

• Plan Wedding Favors

• Plan and order wedding favors as a sign of appreciation for your guests.

Plan Photo and Video Shots

• Work with your photographer/videographer on a shot list.

• Write Your Song List

 Choose songs for your wedding ceremony and reception, including the no-play song list.

• Finalize Food Menu

o Discuss with caterer the final food menu.

Order Stationary

 Order any remaining wedding signs, menus, thank you cards and other stationary you may need.

• Finalize Floral Details

Call your florist or decorator and make sure everything is in order.

Finalize Decor Details

• Order anything else that you may need to decorate your wedding such as wedding signs, artificial flowers, vases, candles etc.

• Finalize Wedding Cake Details

• Contact bakery or caterer to make sure everything is in order.

• Do Hair and Make-Up Trials

Make final decision on hair and make up.

• Book Manicure and Pedicure

Make bookings for the week of the wedding.

Book Wax

Book Haircut (and color if needed)

• Make haircut appointment for 10 days before the wedding.

• Send Wedding & Rehearsal Dinner Invitations

• Create and send out rehearsal dinner and wedding invitations.

Buy Wedding Shoes

· Choose wedding shoes for the big night.

1-2 Months Before

Final Venue Walk-Through

• Visit the venue to confirm setup and layout.

12-18 Months Before SET THE BUDGET

BUDGET ESTIMATE

Before diving into any decisions, it's essential to pinpoint exactly how much you are comfortable spending on your big day.

Sit down with your partner and take a thorough look at your savings, considering how much you can realistically set aside during your engagement.

Discuss with both sets of parents if they are willing to contribute to the wedding.

Once you've tallied up your resources, it's time to map out your budget using our wedding cost list, which outlines the ten primary planning categories.

While our initial estimates provide a helpful starting point, you'll likely need to customize these allocations based on your specific priorities and preferences.

- Venue and Catering: 40% of your budget
- Photography and Videography: 15% of your budget
- Music/Entertainment: 10% of your budget
- Flowers: 10% of your budgetDécor: 10% of your budget
- Wedding Attire and Beauty: 5% of your budget
- Favors and Gifts: 2% of your budget
- Transportation: 3% of your budget
- Stationery: 3% of your budget
- Cake: 2% of your budget

BUDGET TIPS

Here are 10 budgeting tips to consider

- 1. **Start Early:** Begin planning your budget as soon as possible. The earlier you start, the more time you'll have to save and make informed decisions about your spending priorities.
- 2. **Determine Your Total Budget:** Sit down with your partner and any contributing family members to establish a realistic total budget for your wedding. Consider your savings, contributions from family, and any other sources of income.
- 3. **Prioritize Your Expenses:** Identify your top priorities for the wedding. Decide which elements are most important to you and allocate a larger portion of your budget to those areas.
- 4. **Research Costs:** Research the average costs for wedding expenses in your area. Use online resources, consult with vendors, and gather quotes to get a clear understanding of what to expect.
- 5. Create a Detailed Budget Spreadsheet: Use the table on the next few pages or spreadsheet to create a detailed breakdown of your wedding expenses. List each item or service along with its estimated cost and track your actual spending as you go.
- 6. **Be Realistic:** Be realistic about what you can afford and avoid overextending yourselves financially. Don't feel pressured to meet unrealistic expectations or keep up with extravagant trends.
- 7. **Set Aside a Contingency Fund:** Plan for unexpected expenses by setting aside a contingency fund of 5-10% of your total budget. This will give you peace of mind and help cover any unforeseen costs that arise.
- 8. **Track Your Spending:** Keep track of your spending throughout the planning process. Regularly update your budget table and review your expenses to ensure you're staying on track.
- 9. Look for Ways to Save: Explore cost-saving opportunities wherever possible. Consider alternatives to traditional wedding expenses, such as renting or borrowing items, buying printable invitations, using minimalist decor, and considering off-peak days for venues and vendors.
- 10. **Communicate Openly:** Maintain open communication with your partner and any family members contributing to the budget. Discuss any changes or concerns as they arise and make decisions together to ensure everyone is on the same page.

WEDDING INSURANCE Tips

Buying wedding insurance can provide peace of mind and financial protection against unforeseen events that might disrupt your big day. Here are a few tips to consider when purchasing wedding insurance:

1. Understand What Wedding Insurance Covers

- Cancellation/Postponement: Covers costs if you need to cancel or postpone your wedding due to reasons beyond your control (e.g., extreme weather, illness, military deployment). This you should buy as soon as you start paying for deposits.
- Liability Coverage: Protects you if someone gets injured during your wedding or if property is damaged. This is needed only for the wedding day and should be bought a few months before the wedding.
- Vendor Issues: Covers deposits and payments made to vendors who fail to provide services or go out of business. This you should buy as soon as you start paying for deposits.
- Lost/Stolen Items: Covers loss or theft of wedding attire, rings, gifts, and other important items.
- Special Coverage: May include issues like damaged wedding photos, military deployment, or extreme weather.

2. Assess Your Specific Needs

- Venue Requirements: Check if your venue requires liability insurance.
- Destination Weddings: Consider additional coverage for travel, accommodation, and specific destination risks.
- High-Value Items: If your wedding involves expensive items (e.g., a couture gown, valuable rings), ensure they are adequately covered.

3. Research Different Providers

- Compare Policies: Look at different insurance providers and compare their coverage options, limits, and exclusions.
- Read Reviews: Check reviews and ratings of insurance companies to gauge their reliability and customer service.

4. Read the Fine Print

- Policy Exclusions: Understand what is not covered by the policy to avoid surprises later.
- Coverage Limits: Be aware of the maximum amounts the policy will pay out for different types of claims.
- Deductibles: Know if there are any deductibles and how much you will need to pay outof-pocket before the insurance kicks in.
