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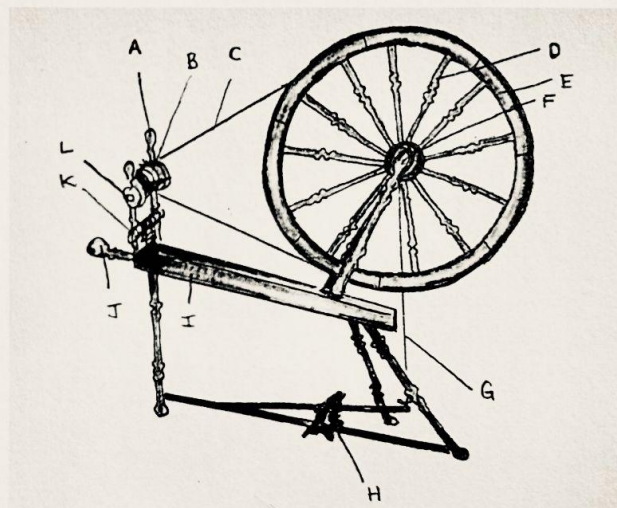

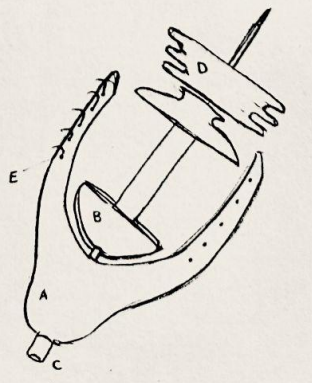
Spinning Wheel

- L Orifice



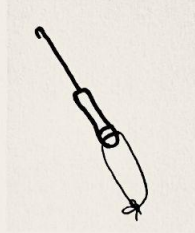
Flyer, Bobbin, Whorl

- E Flyer Hooks



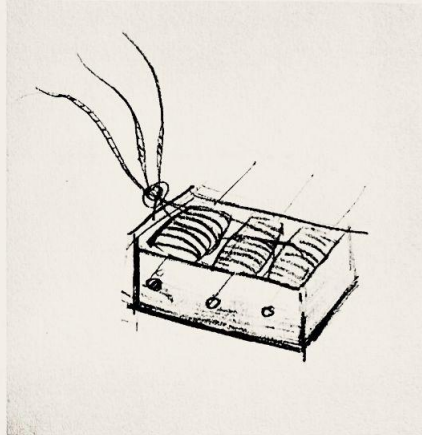
Orifice Hook

Used to pull the end of yarn through the orifice.



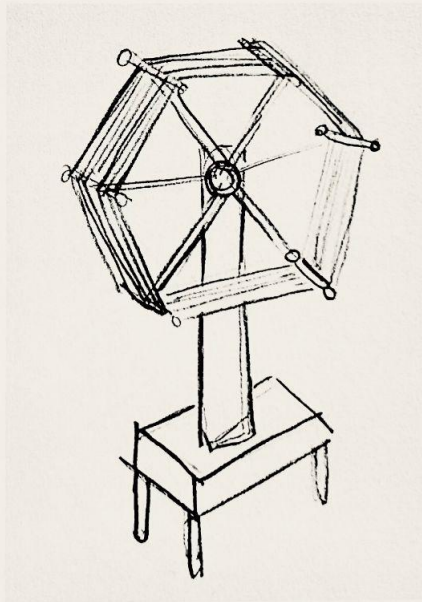
Lazy Kate (not so lazy)

There are many types of lazy kates. Lazy kates keep singles in order while plying. In a bind you can use a cardboard box with knitting needles poked through.



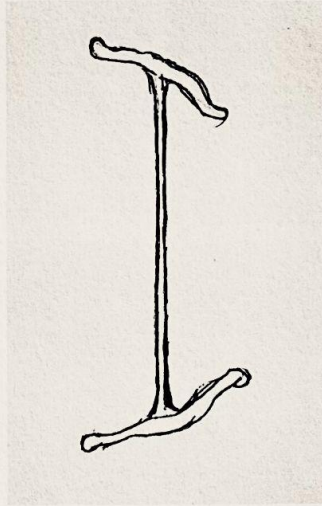
Skein Winder

A skein winder is a tool that helps us wind yarn off of the bobbin to make a loose hank.

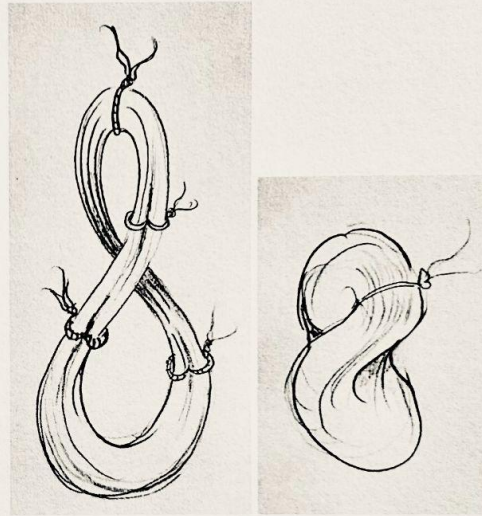


Niddy Noddy
