## Francais-Canadien Fun at the 2018 Fleur-de-Lis Dinner Celebration

The Second Annual *Fleur-de-Lis* Celebration Dinner on September 28 at the Kankakee Country Club was an evening of merriment, socialization, and inspiration. This pivotal event not only provided an opportunity to present an individual with the annual BGHS *Fleur-de-Lis* Award of Excellence for Outstanding Contribution in the Preservation of French colonial, French-Canadian, and Belgian Heritage in the Kankakee and Iroquois River Valleys Corridor, but also to raise funds toward restoration of the log school house. Norma Meier deservedly received the award, and \$2800 has so far been raised in the 2018 campaign to restore the log school house. That amount combined with donations and pledges from 2017 brings the total amount raised to date to over \$10,650. During his remarks after the dinner, the Honorable Jean-Francois Hould (Delegate of the Government of Quebec to the Midwest)—who along with the Honorable Chole, toured the area museums and landmarks—said that he felt like he was at home. Then the Honorable Frederic Chole (French Deputy Consul General) spoke and apologized for being late in his response to attending this year's dinner, but said that he could not miss this event since he had such a good time last year.



Brad Benoit again mesmerized us with his French songs and musical talents. The appetizers, *coq e vin*, and chocolate mousse created by the country club chef were delicious. The celebration dinner 86 attendees came from as far away as Richardson, Texas (Jed and Kim Nagele) and Peoria (Jan Hodel and Dennis Richard). This celebration dinner has become an occasion in which our community expresses: 1) an appreciation for its past treasured heritage; 2) an awareness of combining that heritage with present developments; and 3) a vision for a future that integrates that unique and rich heritage. *I have attached a revised program of the celebration dinner with list of donors on the second page*.
