The "dinnerless" *Fleur-de-Lis* Celebration Dinner fundraiser campaign continues. All proceeds go to the restoration of Bourbonnais Grove's first log schoolhouse on the grounds of the Adrien M. Richard Heritage Preserve. Donations to date for 2020 (not counting pledges) are \$4225 bringing the total amount donated since 2017 to nearly \$40,000 with another \$12,500 in pledges.
