All proceeds go to the restoration of Bourbonnais Grove's first log schoolhouse on the grounds of the Adrien M. Richard Heritage Preserve. This fundraiser campaign continues with 3 months left to register/donate for this year.

The previous three *Fleur-de-Lis* Celebration Dinners at the Kankakee Country Club highlighted French-Canadian cuisine. In conjunction with this "dinnerless" cuisine theme, the BGHS invites the local community to prepare one of the French-Canadian recipes at https://frenchcanadians.kcc.edu/resources/recipes/recipes.html) and/or submit a personal favorite French-Canadian recipe for a future BGHS French-Canadian recipe book. Suggested donations for the 2020 *Fleur-de-Lis* "Dinnerless" Celebration are \$55 per person (BGHS member) and \$65 per person (non-member).




Garden Beautification Peaks in September
