French Heritage Corridor to hold its second conference on May 12-13



Log schoolhouse reconstruction resumes

Log Schoolhouse Advisory Committee member Laurie Cyr reported at the April 14 committee meeting that in the next few days, the pad will be poured for the fake outhouse (utility building). It will be coed and have a half moon on the door. She said also that before the end of the month, the wiring for HVAC will be done, and the decking for the log schoolhouse will be

completed. Next will be the placing of the 16 new logs onto the original logs, and the chinking process will be done. The onsite (next to the Letourneau Home/Museum) schoolhouse construction is still estimated to be completed in May or June 2022.

On April 4, I presented the log schoolhouse Historic Landmark Prequalification Form application to the Kankakee County Historic Preservation Commission. Mayor Schore remarked during the Advisory Committee meeting that the Village of Bourbonnais could use the forms for the log schoolhouse historic landmark process that were used to designate the Letourneau Home as a Village of Bourbonnais historic landmark.





On Friday April 8, I offered a tour of the Letourneau Home/Museum and gardens to Rodney Miller's high school history class. They are currently studying local history. Rodney is fourth from the left in the photograph above. His students were very inquisitive and appreciative of this step back in time.

Restructuring plan for BGHS is moving forward

Daron Kinzinger and I met on April 11 to hammer out several details regarding the restructuring of the BGHS. I have drafted bylaw language in which all current officers join the current board members on one Board of Directors. The board meetings would combine board and membership issues. A more defined committee structure will be included. Daron is editing the bylaw language draft. After he is done, we will submit it to the membership for approval. Legris home to become a vacation rental by owner (VRBO)





The Joseph Legris Home (at left) has been recently purchased and will be turned into a vacation rental. The history of the home will be publicized and become an integral part of the site's appeal. The home is located at 465 S. Main Street in Bourbonnais and dates back to 1857. After amassing a small fortune in the gold mines of California, Joseph Legris returned to Bourbonnais Grove, married Cleophil Sylvester, and built a small cabin in 1857. The home's present kitchen is the original log constructed dwelling. Mr. Legris added rooms to the home as his family grew. Legris and his sons opened two banks in Kankakee. Mr. Legris was a member of the village board, and spent his declining years in this home. We are grateful to Norma Meier for providing genealogical information on the Legris family to the new owners. The "Legris" name stone (at right above) will be donated to the Adrien M. Richard Heritage Preserve.
