On Thursday August 4, Francis DuVoisin and his son Bob came to the Perry Farm House to meet some of the new Bourbonnais Township Park District leadership team: Dave Zinanni, Board President; Dr. Ed Piatt, Executive Director; Cherie Smolkovich, Marketing Director, Kelli Brza, Accounting and Human Resources; and Mike Crews, Superintendent of Parks. Francis was the last tenant farmer and then owner of the Durham-Perry Farmstead before the BTPD assumed ownership. Francis will be 100 years old on March 1, 2023. #### Who am I?

I was class treasurer at St. Viator College. After graduation, I was best known for my work on television and radio. For 20 years, I hosted the night-time radio program "The Catholic Hour" (1930–1950) before moving to television and presenting "Life Is Worth Living" (1951–1957). My final role was on the syndicated "The \_\_\_\_\_ Program" (1961–1968) with a format very similar to that of the earlier "Life is Worth Living" show. For this work, I twice won an Emmy Award for Most Outstanding Television Personality, and was featured on the cover of *Time Magazine*. Starting in 2009, my shows have been re-broadcast on the EWTN and the Trinity Broadcasting Network's Church Channel cable. I was born in 1895 and died in 1979. Who am I?
