Illinois legislature recognizes all who volunteer in historical societies

On May 25th, the Illinois 103rd General Assembly passed HJR58 which declares June 15, 2024, as History Day in the State of Illinois. The Joint Resolution recognizes all those who volunteer at historical societies in Illinois for all they do the preserve and spread our history. The Joint Resolution was sponsored by State Senator Patrick Joyce and State Representative Jackie Haas. BGHS Executive Vice-President Ken Ponton initiated the passage of this Joint Resolution. Vic Johnson wrote that Henry F. Tower, at the age of 92, reported in a 1929 interview with local historian Burt Burroughs that he attended the Bourbonnais Grove log school in 1847 at the age of 11 with two of Noel LeVasseur's children. We are those two children. One of us was born in 1838 and the other in 1840. **Who are we?** Tower also recalled that his teacher, Mr. Starr, boarded at Thomas and Margaret Durham's home.


