



I am hoping to institute the following practices for Lent:

**Be thankful and enjoy life** – this advice from Chief Oren Lyons in *Spiritual Ecology* really resonated with me. The place we start in Lent is not with cutting back but with being thankful. "Thankfulness inspires respect" he says. If, each day we express thankfulness for one aspect of creation—the rising of the sun, the wind in our hair, the grace of birds in the air, the beauty of flowers and of passersby in the street, then our respect for creation grows. On top of that we realize how intimately connected to creation we are.

**Continue a plant based diet**. By avoiding meat and cheese one day a week during Lent (or beyond) would be the equivalent of taking 7.6 million cars off the road for an equivalent time. (The Meat Eater's Guide) Eating locally requires fewer fossil fuels to transport your food, seasonally requires less energy for refrigeration, organically helps restore soil ecosystems and pull carbon out of the atmosphere.

A Carbon fast. I can give you some great ideas for a carbon fast: take a walk and feel your environment, turn off lights in your home that you are not using, turn off water when brushing your teeth—or washing fruits and veggies, begin a plastic free journey—what can you reduce, use public transportation, reduce the amount of trash you toss, commit to no bottled water, have dinner by candlelight, set your fridge temperature around 38 F, have a no electronics day (See me if you want more ideas). I plan to focus on one each week rather than one each day so that I don't get overloaded.

**Spring clean** and refuse to use plastic where possible. Lent was traditionally a season of spring cleaning as a symbol of our inner need for cleaning and I think that getting rid of plastic as much as possible from our lives is one way to symbolize the change of thinking that we want to adhere too. And of course it is not just things like plastic bags, plastic storage containers, or plastic cutting boards that we need to think about getting rid of. Microplastics are ubiquitous in our world and though the jury is still out on how harmful they are there are some concerning reports that we need to think about. And Microplastics occur in everything from tea bags to fleece garments and cosmetics. So it might be time to buy only natural fibers and cut back on cosmetics or research those that do not contain Microplastics. I use something called a Cora Ball in my laundry to catch microfibers from fabrics so they don't go into our water system.

So instead of "giving up" something for Lent I plan to begin new practices and be more mindful with these things I have listed above. I am also going to begin a Gratitude Journal and write down 3 things I am grateful for when I wake up each morning and 3 things I am grateful for before I go to sleep each evening. I encourage each of you to consider taking on new habits for good health, for healthy and loving relationships, for living abundantly in God's loving presence. Listen closely to the Holy Spirit this Lent and find those blessings God want to give you. See you Sunday! **Rev Day**



## A NATIONAL CALL FOR MORAL REVIVAL

#### In Florida:

#### Poverty:

47% of people in Florida are poor or low income—a total of 9.8 million residents. This includes 60% of children (2.5 million), 52% of women (5.4 million), 66% of Black people (2 million), 63% of LatinX people (3.3 million), and 39% of White people (4.3 million). From 1979 to 2012, income for the top 1% grew by 176%, while income for the bottom 99% actually fell 12%.

#### Systemic Racism:

60% of the eligible voting-age population turned out in 2016. More than 1.6 million residents cannot vote due to felony disenfranchisement, including 499,000 Black people (21% of the Black pop.) Of the 98,000 people imprisoned in FL as of 2017, about 60% are people of color. Black residents in FL are incarcerated at over 3 times the rate of White residents.

#### Militarism and the War Economy:

From 2008 to 2014, FL law enforcement received at least \$43.68 billion in federal military equipment. Over 404,000 veterans have incomes below \$35,000, or about 26% of the FL veteran population. FL has over 60 Ice Detention Centers as of 2019. Over 141,000 people were deported from 2003 to 2018, and over 89,000 removal cases are currently pending. Meanwhile, 775,000 residents are undocumented, and 7% of K-12 students have undocumented parents.

#### **Ecology and Health:**

2.7 million Floridians are uninsured as of 2018 and 31% census tracts in FL are at-risk for being unable to afford water.

#### Everybody's got a Right to Live:

Over 31,000 people in FL are homeless as of 2018.

Working at the FL minimum wage it takes 108 hours per week to afford a 2 bedroom apartment. 50% of FL's workforce makes less than \$15/hr. FL's minimum wage is \$8.46, a living wage in FL would be \$26.13/hr.



As you probably already know, Brandon Christian Church is a polling place for Hillsborough County. 2020 is a major election year with the Presidency, the entire House of Representatives, many Senators, and many FL State offices are up for grabs. Because it is a major election year we will have several instances of the Fellowship Hall being closed or off limits to accommodate the County Supervisor of Elections and the rules that have been established to ensure the machines and voting process are not tampered with.

#### 2020 Election Dates:

Presidential Preference Primary—March 17th (FHall will be off limits 3/16 and 3/17)

2020 Primary Election—August 18th (FHall will be off limits 8/17 and 8/18)

2020 General Election—November 3rd (FHall will be off limits 11/2 and 11/3)

From the time the machines are setup until they are done with the voting we need to keep the Fellowship Hall empty to ensure they aren't tampered with prior to voting.

On the days where voting is taking place, it is asked that we use the Bryan Rd side for parking and entering the building, this will reduce traffic and confusion out back

where the voters will be parking and entering and exiting under the portico.
