Pastor Richard N-sanze Holy Deliverance Ministry In Uganda





Pastor N-sanze has about 150 people in his congregation, but many others come to hear him.

The way we met Brother Richard was that a young girl wanted to be friends with us on Facebook and we found she went to his church and contacted him to help her.

In August of 2019, after <u>not</u> talking with him for several months, we got a text at 5:30am saying "Praise the Lord." We had been praying through night and day, and we believed that was the message from the Lord that God had answered our prayers.

We began talking on messenger with Brother Richard more. He showed us his bamboo and mortar church in the slums, about 4 kilometers from the City Square of the capital city of Kampala.



Bother Richard says he feels touched, and feels a need to help sick people, single mothers, and vulnerable children. He had eight siblings when his father died in an accident and his mother and family suffered a very hard life. His sister is recently a widow with 4 children. Finances are a challenge.

He was able to study and was helped through the Project

Team of World Vision, but they are not helping now. He really needs vision supporters basically to help single moms and for children to study for a bright future.



God gave him a vision that Abigale was teaching his children. So she began texting him lessons used in teaching others.

Brother Richard teaches them to study the Word of God and to live it.





Brother Richard told us of his desire for deliverance to be taught to all of Uganda. We watched his ministry on Facebook and could see he was filled with the Holy Spirit.

He asked us to teach there. We texted him some of the book called "The Truth in Deliverance," and he wanted 1,000 copies.



It was a learning curve to find out how to mail books and materials, and how to send money to Uganda. To wire money the cost of our bank is \$45 here, and their bank charges \$35. So, it cost \$80 just to send money. Five books cost about \$40 to send. After praying we thought it would be more helpful for him to have a computer and download the book and teachings on line.

Then he could teach with the book power points, and have a printer for copies to hand out prayers. Total cost would be about \$1200. We did not have the money to send and asked Jesus to provide. That month, the State of Texas gave retired teachers a bonus of about that amount. It was a one time bonus. Amazing how God quickly provided!!!!



In learning more about Uganda, we read that there is no solid middle



class, and that the leaders make lots of rules, but they are not implemented. They do not have help for the very poor areas, so poverty is prevalent. Jobs are hard to find and do not pay much. In this area, there are many women raising children themselves. We know about that in our country. It is much harder there.



There are some large churches in the city, even one that sits 10,000 people, and the pastors meet often and pray together. Wealthy people go only to cathedrals, not the local or lower churches.

The people at his church are serious about the Word of God and worshipping the Lord. They meet everyday and study the Word, pray for each other, and sing praises. They trust in God and collect for the needy among their congregation.




















Brother Richard travels to a place where there is a village that is very poor. He purchased land for them to grow food. He calls it the Garden.









Bother Richard travels once a week to work in the Garden and he supplies much of their needs with the little he makes from working handyman jobs. He has to spend the night as he takes a taxi to get there in the day. A small motorbike would really be helpful to him. He stays with a family that lives in the Garden.











Bother Richard has friends that sometimes bring supplies or take people into town in his friend's truck.

The church meets everyday, and they have special occasions and conferences. **Brother Richard** stays very busy with his congregation.











During the last few months we have gone through some trials and tests and they have prayed for us. We are very thankful that they care about us, and we care about them. We save and give gifts and offerings as the Lord leads us, and for right now, we are blessed by giving to them. We have asked for a list of their needs. We hope others will have on their hearts to help with some of the list.

Pastor N-sanze has begun teaching some of the principles of Truth in the book, The Truth in Deliverance, sent to him and will be translating it in to their native language of Swahili.
