
COLLARDZ 4 KIDZ the heirloom varieties

Cabbage Collards

This popular variety forms a loose central head if left to grow for an extended season.

Ultracross

Twenty-one heirloom varieties have cross pollinated to create a coldhardy, beautifully diverse and delicious collard mix.

Ultracross Collard

Tree Collards With stems that elongate more than normal, these varieties can survive multiple seasons in mild climates.

Glazed Collards

Gene mutations produce waxes that cover leaves, which results in the glossy or glazed characteristic of these collards.

Green Glaze Collard

Heading Collards

Due to short petioles, the leaves of this variety curl into a heading structure, forming a leafy structure.

Morris Heading Collard

Purple Tree Collard

Color Variations

Most color variations in collards range from yellow green to blue-green.
