### Cabbage Collards

This popular variety forms a loose central head if left to grow for an extended season.

### Ultracross

Twenty-one heirloom varieties have cross-pollinated to create a cold-hardy, beautifully diverse and delicious collard mix.

### Glazed Collards

Gene mutations produce waxes that cover leaves, which results in the glossy or glazed characteristic of these collards.

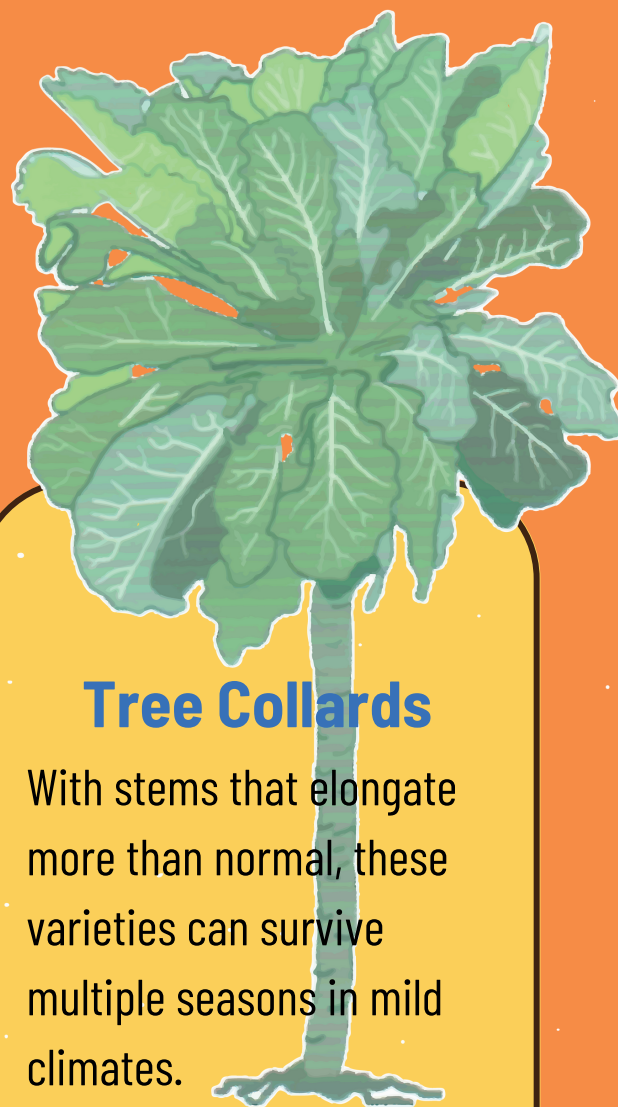
**Green Glaze Collard**



### Heading Collards

Due to short petioles, the leaves of this variety curl into a heading structure, forming a leafy structure.

### Tree Collards

With stems that elongate more than normal, these varieties can survive multiple seasons in mild climates.

Most color variations in collards range from yellow-green to blue-green.
