DANCING WITH GOD

When I mediated on the word Guidance, I kept seeing "dance" at the end of the word. I remember reading that doing God's will is a lot like dancing.

When two people try to lead, nothing feels right. The movement doesn't flow with the music, and everything is quite uncomfortable and jerky.

When one person realizes that, and lets the other lead, both bodies begin to flow with the music.

One gives gentle cues, perhaps with a nudge to the back or by pressing lightly in one direction or another.

It's as if two become one body, moving beautifully. The dance takes

surrender, willingness, and attentiveness from one person and gentle guidance and skill from the other.

My eyes drew back to the word Guidance. When I saw "G" I thought of God, followed by "u" and "i".

"God," "u" and "i" dance. God, You and I dance.

As I lowered my head, I became willing to trust that I would get guidance about my life. I became willing to let God lead. (Vol. 109, No. 5 – First Catholic Slovak Ladies Association – February 2023)

FOOD PANTRY REPORT FOR 2022

God has blessed the Food Pantry greatly this year by guiding so many in the churches to donate money and food, but also the people in the communities in which the churches are located to become involved and the schools actively donating food and money. The Food Pantry Board can not thank everyone enough, for without your support the clients who come in would not receive the food needed.

At the Food Pantry's January 9th meeting, a year-end report was filed. Here are the financial as well as the client figures for the year 2022.

Received: Donations: \$17,813.54 Fund Raisers \$2,945.52 Culvers and Bake Sale and Hot Dogs at Kabelins

Grants \$2,714.29 Unity Foundation

Misc. 166.33

\$23,639.68

The miscellaneous money came from interest, Pop cans, Memorials.

Additional resources came from MEIJER CERTIFICATES \$7,649, so there was \$31,289.30 income in 2022. There was a balance of money from 2021 which enabled the Pantry to make the food purchases necessary as can be observed by the following expenditures for 2022

Miscellaneous expenses were office supplies, tax filings, mileage, insurance, and pantry electric paid to UMC (\$600)

With the increase in gasoline, the Board felt the need to pay Sue and Dan for the mileage to the Food Bank each week.

At Thanksgiving 87 families received a turkey and all the fixing to go with it as well as their usual food received each week. At Christmas 81 families

received a ham as well as their usual food. The Lion's Club donated half of the turkeys and half of the hams.

This is the report on the clients served in 2022.

There was a total of 1224 families served throughout the year. In those families 4,238 individuals were fed. This compares with 2021 in this way families served 759... Individuals served in those families 2,490. You can see that in a year's time the need at the pantry has almost doubled Therefore, the need is great so please keep praying for these families and for the Pantry that it can continue to serve God by serving those in need.

One way you can is to help in the fund raisers being planned. Culvers has all its days taken, so we cannot use this. The Board is planning a couple of times at Kabelin's with a bake sale and \$ for Dogs. A new fund raiser you are asked to consider helping with is Meijer's. If you shop at Meijer's in Michigan City, the Board would appreciate you participating. It works like this: Wayne, Jeremy and Rose have cards. If you participate, one of those people will give you a card. The Pantry's name is on the code. When you shop give the card to the clerk and have her/him add \$10 to your shopping bill. Do this on March 4th or March 25th or both days and Meijer will double your \$10 dollars. The Food Pantry will receive \$30 worth of shopping dollars -your \$10 plus Meijer's \$20.

The Pantry has received over \$1000 Meijer dollars last year and this year. The APPRECIATION DINNER will be in March. All in the church family are invited to attend because you are part of this church therefore YOU

contribute to the Food Pantry.

The Lord God of your fathers has spoken to you; do not fear or be discouraged. Deuteronomy 1:21 It's natural to become discouraged, but it's unhealthy to stay that way. Satan loves to utilize the giant of discouragement to cast down our faith and progress. John Bunyan called it Giant Despair in his timeless classic The Pilgrim's Progress, and it imprisoned Christian until he found the Key of Promise in his clothing.

If Giant Despair has you in his dungeon today, remember you have the key to escape. It's inside your Bible, found in one of the hundreds of promises God has given you. For example, you can claim Joshua 1:9, which says, "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go" (NIV).
