

Caregiver's lives are so very: stressful, exhausting, frustrating, fill in any other adjective that is appropriate, especially the longer time goes on...

Many of us are now or have been in this role, not by choice but because of unforeseen circumstances & necessity.

We go into it with a head full of steam, energy, optimism, but as it continues, our batteries become drained, can't seem to find the jumper cables thus can no longer be jump started...

Our loved ones are tired of not feeling well, held captive at home for long periods of time and they may become grumpy and then you too find yourself growling back... Sometimes baring teeth....

There are many in our church, Fathers, Mothers, Daughters, Granddaughters, Wives, Husbands, Sisters, Brothers, Grandmothers, Grandfathers, Aunts, Uncles, all doing what they can filling this not so coveted or wanted role...

I was thrust into the role of caregiver 8 years ago, May 2013, when Dave

suffered a brain aneurysm. It was challenging, to say the least and life forever changed...

God got us through it, although sometimes it wasn't real pretty... I'm sure He has shaken His head at me plenty of times...

9 months ago, Dave had knee replacement surgery, and although the knee surgery itself was probably a success, it brought on an onslaught of medical issues, one after another...

A small opening in the incision that refused to heal, which required many antibiotics, a compression fracture in his back from one of the falls, three seizures, Covid, Cellulitis, and unfortunately, has aggravated his cirrhosis of liver.

I would like to say I have responded kindly, lovingly, gracefully, all things God would be proud of me, these last 4 months especially. But alas! No! The words that fit me more often than not, are Irritated, Frustrated, Angry, Annoyed, and more... Pretty downright UGLY... 😞 Certainly not racking up many crowns to lay at the feet of Jesus when that time comes.

If you only had to be in this position for a couple weeks, or month, MAYBE you get through unscathed, but when it starts dragging into weeks, months years, I guess it starts to wear on you...

Say a prayer for all caregivers, if you know their names, whisper them into God's ear...

I recently found the prayer below and need to make my morning prayer.

A Prayer for Caregivers

Lord, help me remember,
I am doing your work.

Help me to clothe myself with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, forgiveness, and love. Help me to live out and embody the fruit of the Spirit showing love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-

Mother's Day

Have you ever wondered how Mother's Day got started? People started honoring Mother's a very long time ago. When it first started it was called Mothering Sunday because people celebrated it the fourth Sunday during a time called Lent. Lent is the time before Easter where people think and prepare about the Easter story and what God did for us.

Then 150 years ago a woman named Anna Jarvis, organized a day to raise awareness of poor health conditions in her community, something she thought mothers believed in doing. She called it "Mother's Work Day."

After Anna Jarvis died, her daughter (also named Anna) wanted to honor all that her mother did. Anna heard her mother say that one day she hoped someone would make a special day just for mothers.

So Anna worked very hard and even talked to presidents and other leaders

to try to create a special day just to honor them. By 1914 (almost 100 years ago) a man named Woodrow Wilson signed a bill recognizing Mother's Day as a national holiday.

It just so happens that Anna's mothers' favorite flower was the white carnation and that's why mothers often receive carnations on Mother's Day.

The funny thing is, Anna ended up disliking Mother's Day. She didn't want Mother's Day to be all about the expensive gifts and fancy flowers but just a day to tell your mom that you love and appreciate her. So, remember, moms don't need all that fancy stuff. Make her a nice card and treat her very special today (and everyday) and she won't need anything else.

Mothers are very special, so special that they are mentioned in the Bible. Since the Bible is like an instruction manual for us, it gives us instructions on how to treat our mother.

Do any of you know what the ten commandments are? They were rules that God gave to Moses for all of us to follow. Each commandment is very important and God gave each commandment for a reason. One of the commandments says: Honor your father and you mother, so that all may go well for you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth.

What does honor mean anyway? Honor can mean many things. When we listen, obey, love, appreciate, and forgive our mom that is how we honor her. That means when she asks you to do something you should do it right away without complaining.

When you show you love your mom by hugging her and telling her that you love her that's another way to honor. You can also appreciate your mom by thanking her when she does things for you (cleaning the house and your clothes, making supper, helping you, etc.).

Our mom won't be perfect all the time, we all make mistakes. So, we should forgive our moms when they make mistakes because God asks us too.

Another verse in the Bible asks us to bless our mom. It says, "Her children arise and call her blessed." Some words that describe blessed are that your mom belongs to God and we need to treat her like she's God's child. Your mom used to be a child too and she's just trying her best to help you grow and learn things. So, treat her nicely!

Another way to describe blessed is to be happy. Do you make your mom happy? I'm sure you do a lot of the time and moms can be sad because of different things sometimes too, but I don't think your mom would be happy if you didn't listen to her or disobeyed her.

The last verse we're going to talk about today says: Children, obey your parents in everything, for this pleases the Lord. I know that sometimes you don't always want to obey your parents but its important that you obey them because it makes God happy!

One last thing. No matter how old you get your mom is your mom. Sometimes you might think that you can talk back to our parents or that you know more than them, but you don't. The Bible says to obey your parents always, not just when

you're a kid. Your parents want the best for you and know what they're talking about.

Don't forget that we also have a heavenly father that cares and loves us no matter what. So, if you don't have a mother around all the time (or even if you do) God is always there. He is there when our mother can't be.

Thank You God for our Moms! Amen
