From our Pastor

Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

Today the Church celebrates the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome—one of the more unusual feasts in our liturgical calendar. It does not commemorate a saint or a biblical event, but a building—specifically, the Basilica of St. John Lateran. Although St. Peter's Basilica is more famous and visually stunning, the Lateran Basilica is actually the Pope's cathedral. Every bishop has a cathedral, and the Bishop of Rome—our Holy Father—has his at St. John Lateran, not St. Peter's.

So where does this basilica get its name? We call it "St. John Lateran," yet there is no Saint John Lateran. The name "Lateran" refers to the land on which it stands—property once owned by the Roman senator Flavius Lateranus. Its full title is much longer: The Archbasilica of the Most Holy Savior and of Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist at the Lateran. Now you know why we shorten it!

Why does the Church celebrate the dedication of this basilica?

First, because it is the "mother of all churches." Across its façade is the Latin inscription: "Mother and mistress of all the churches of Rome and the world." When we celebrate its dedication, we celebrate the "birthday" of the mother church of the entire worlda sign of unity with the Bishop of Rome.

Every diocese governs itself, but every bishop remains in communion with the Pope, the successor of St. Peter. This feast reminds us that our unity in faith and love extends far beyond our local parish; it links us to the universal Church.

Second, it reminds us of the sacred importance of a church building. After the Second Vatican Council, some misunderstood the teaching that the Church is the People of God. The focus shifted so heavily toward the people that the building itself was sometimes treated as secondary—a mere "gathering space." As a result, many churches were stripped of their beauty: murals painted over, statues removed, stained-glass windows discarded, communion rails torn out.

Today, we recognize that the loss of beauty was a mistake. Beauty matters. Space matters. Architecture shapes faith. A church is not simply a place where people gather—it is a place where God dwells. It is a place of encounter. In every Catholic church, Jesus Christ is truly present in the Blessed Sacrament within the tabernacle. That alone makes it holy ground.

This feast challenges us to ask: How do we treat the house of God? We keep silence in church not merely to avoid disturbing others, but to show reverence to the Lord who is present. The very structure of the church points us toward heaven. Its altar, its art, its candles, and its crucifix—all proclaim: "God is here."

Today, as we honor the dedication of the Lateran Basilica, we also give thanks for our own parish church. May it always remain a place of prayer, beauty, and deep encounter with the living God. And may we, the living stones of Christ's Church, be built together into a spiritual temple that glorifies God in all we do.


Wednesday Prayer Service

All Souls' Altar




All are invited to continue to bring photos and funeral programs of their dearly departed loved ones to place on the All-Souls Altar in the vestibule. Prayer
