From our Pastor

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Pharisee, the Tax Collector, and the Rest of Us

Jesus' story about the Pharisee and the tax collector is one of those parables that makes everyone squirm because it's not really about them. It's about us.

If Jesus were telling this parable today, He might have said, "Two people logged onto Facebook to pray..." One began typing: "Lord, I thank You that I'm not like those people who skip Mass on Sundays, don't recycle, and still use plastic straws. I volunteer, tithe online, and my prayer life is perfectly color-coded in my bullet journal." The other quietly posted: "Lord, have mercy on me... I'm still a mess." And guess which one got God's "like"?

The Pharisee wasn't a villain; he was the parish star the kind of guy we'd elect chair of the Parish Council. He fasted, tithed, and probably knew the parish directory by heart. The tax collector, on the other hand, was the guy people whispered about after Mass: "Isn't that the one who..."

Yet, in the temple that day, the religious man's prayer went up and bounced right back down like a text to the wrong number. Why? Because

he wasn't really praying to God, he was praying about himself. His "O God, I thank you" quickly turned into "that I'm better than... "Meanwhile, the tax collector simply stood in the back, head down, beating his chest. He didn't list achievements; he confessed a need. And that's what got heaven's attention.

Humility isn't self-hatred; it's honesty before God. The Pharisee brought a résumé; the tax collector brought repentance. The first came to impress; the second came to be transformed.

If we're honest, there's a little Pharisee and a little tax collector inside each of us. We want to look holy and successful to others, maybe even to God. But grace can't fill a heart that's already full of self-admiration.

Imagine God interrupting our prayers sometimes: "Thank you for the update, but how's your heart doing?" Jesus' punchline hits hard: "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted." In God's Kingdom, the elevator only goes down and that's how you rise.

So here's the challenge for this week: next time you pray, don't list your spiritual credentials. Instead, bring your spiritual wounds. Tell God where it hurts. Pray like the tax collector: short, honest, real. You don't need big words just a big heart.

And if you catch yourself thinking, "At least I'm not like that Pharisee," congratulations — you've just become one.

Together, we will discuss the upcoming Sunday gospel, share our prayer intentions, and conclude with a powerful closing prayer. Come and strengthen your faith with our community!


Spaghetti Dinner


