From our Pastor

Second Sunday of Advent

"A Shoot from the Stump of Jesse: Hope Growing Out of the Impossible"

Have you ever seen a tree stump that looked completely dead, cut down, dried out, and absolutely finished, only to find, months later, a tiny green shoot poking out of it? It's as if creation itself whispered, "Not so fast... I'm not done yet." That is exactly the image Isaiah gives us on this second Sunday of Advent: "A shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse."

The stump of Jesse is not a poetic decoration. It is a theological punch in the gut. Israel had once been a mighty tree, a flourishing kingdom under David and Solomon. But sin, division, war, and exile had reduced that glory to a stump. No king. No power. No future. Just a memory...and a stump.

Yet God says: Watch that stump. Because Advent is the season when God shows us that the places in our lives that look cut down, broken, and barren are exactly where He loves to plant hope.

Think about it: God rarely starts His greatest works from thriving palaces.

He starts from stumps:

- a forgotten couple, Zechariah and Elizabeth
- a teenage girl in Nazareth with nothing but faith
- a carpenter's workshop
- a manger in Bethlehem
- a cross on Calvary

God specializes in holy surprises sprouting from hopeless places. Isaiah tells us this shoot will be filled with the Spirit of wisdom, understanding, counsel, strength, knowledge, and fear of the Lord. This is no ordinary shoot—this is the Messiah, Jesus Christ, the One who turns spiritual desert land into gardens of grace.

And this is what Advent is about: Waiting, watching, and believing that God is doing something new, right where life feels cut down to the stump.

Let's be honest many of us have stumps in our lives. The stump of broken relationships. The stump of discouragement. The stump of worry. The stump of "I thought my life would look different by now." Sometimes we don't feel like flourishing trees; we feel like people just trying to keep the squirrels away from what's left. But Advent challenges us: Do you believe that God can make something grow again? Not in theory, not in someone else's life—in yours.

The challenge of Advent is this, God doesn't ask if the stump is ready to grow. He doesn't check its moisture level or call an arborist. He simply acts. Grace sprouts without permission. Christ comes whether we feel ready or not. He comes to the weary, the distracted, the spiritually sleepy (yes, even us who promised last Advent that we would do better this Advent!). He comes not because we have everything in order, but because He is the One who brings order to our chaos.

This Sunday, Isaiah invites us to look at our stumps with new eyes. Not as endings, but as beginnings. Not as proof of failure, but as soil of grace. Not as dead places, but as holy spaces waiting for Christ to bloom. So, this Advent watch your stumps. God is not finished. Hope has already begun to grow.

Invitation From Our Choir




