GAUDETE SUNDAY



If you've ever been outside before sunrise, you'll notice something very fascinating about an hour or so before the actual sunrise. The sky starts out black of course, and then it fairly gets bright – usually a bright blue. Then, as sunrise gets nearer, but still before you can actually see the Sun, the sky explodes into a symphony of beautiful rose color.

And so today, we take a slight break from the Advent purple, and we light the Rose-colored candle, the 3rd in the series of the Advent wreath. This is to indicate that the Son_of God; the light of the world is already on the Horizon. Ready to illumine the whole world. And we have all the reason to REJOICE.

And that's why the Church calls the 3rd Sunday of Advent, *Gaudete* Sunday. *Gaudete* is a Latin word, which means REJOICE. The cause for our rejoicing isn't because there are presents under the X-Mass tree or because family is coming to visit out of town on Christmas Day. But we rejoice because the one who saves us from our sins is on the horizon and he will fill the earth with His presence. Let us therefore diligently continue to prepare the coming of our salvation especially during this significant week of advent.
