Our readings this week all speak of the distinctive characteristics of the people God gathers to achieve God's purposes.

The deep communion of love that God envisions requires a community that is humble and lowly, as Zephaniah describes. God chooses the weak and foolish to reveal God's strength and wisdom, as Paul says. And in the Beatitudes, Jesus teaches that a people who know their weakness and vulnerability can most fully place their trust in God and work for a just world.

As Christians, we believe God will fully heal our world when Christ returns. But Christ also invites us to experience a foretaste of this future right now, through our life in Christian community, and in our work of peacemaking and justice-seeking in the world.

Our poverty in spirit can enable us to be both recipients and instruments of the "kingdom of heaven" here and now.

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The People of God's Kingdon

In our Gospel reading from Matthew, we hear the Beatitudes, the stirring opening to the Sermon on the Mount.

Jesus is proclaiming the coming of the kingdom of God, and begins by considering what kind of people will enter and participate in this kingdom. They are the poor in spirit, the meek, the clean of heart, the peacemakers. We hear both Zephaniah and Paul echo this, as God specifically chooses the weak and the lowly to be God's agents in ushering in the reign of God.

By living with humility and integrity, their hearts are open to being transformed by the grace of God. We too are called to live in this way. Jesus invites us to be people with open hearts, to receive God's blessing.

And working through us, God may bless all of creation.

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the bingdom of heaven.



FRUITS OF THE SPIRIT

At the Last Supper Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever remains in me . . . will bear much fruit" (John 15.5).

What did Jesus mean when he spoke of us bearing fruit? Certainly not fruit that grows on trees. He meant that if we remain close to him and follow his teachings, we will be able to do many good things. The Church teaches that when we try to good things—to produce good fruit—the fruits of the Holy Spirit will flourish in us (see Galatians 5:22–23).



Patience

One of the Spirit's fruits is joy. Think of some of the things you do, for others and for yourself, that bring you joy. It might be sharing something, giving a gift, or helping someone who is sad or is hurt. When you do these things you produce something good that creates joy in you. Some other fruits of the Spirit are named in the circles. Write or draw a picture showing something you might do or say that would bring that fruit of the Holy Spirit to you.


Eucharistic Ministers


