#### LIGHT OF THE WORLD

Epiphany can be understood as an extension of the Nativity of the Lord that we celebrate on December 25. While at Christmas we celebrate Jesus' coming as the long-awaited king and Messiah of the Jewish people, on Epiphany we celebrate the revelation that Jesus is the Savior and Light of all nations—Jews, Gentiles, and all people.

The star shines so brightly that it attracts magi who come from far distant countries to worship Jesus. They are not Jews, yet they are drawn to the Light of the world. The letter to the Ephesians reveals that the Light of the world was for the Gentiles as well as the Jews—Christ gathers all people into the light of his love. The reading from Isaiah also describes a gathering of diverse peoples, but this time it is to the light that emanates from the people of God.

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Feast of the Epiphany
In days of old, God's
presence was veiled.
We could not see God.
The Good News that we
celebrate during the
Season of Christmas is
that God has chosen to

reveal himself. God has chosen to remove the veil and God appeared to us in the flesh.

In the person of Jesus Christ, God visited his people. Now we can see God and touch God and hear God. The word Epiphany means to manifest, to reveal. On this Feast of Epiphany we celebrate that Jesus is made manifest as a Light to the Gentiles. The Magi represent all of us. We are all on a journey to God. Our goal is the beatific vision: to see God face to face.

The gifts that the Magi bring to Jesus reveal – make manifest who Jesus is. Gold is a gift for a king. Jesus is our Lord and King. He is the Messiah. Incense is used to worship God. This gift reveals that Jesus is true Lord and God. And myrrh is burial spice. This seems like a strange gift to give a baby! Why give Jesus a burial spice. It foreshadows the whole reason Jesus came: He came to suffer and die for us. His whole purpose of coming is to save us by offering his life of the cross for our salvation.

Now this all sounds nice, but what about us here today? How does Jesus manifest his presence to us in 2020? How do I know God is real? The surest way we can know God's presence - the way God manifests Himself to us today is through the Fruits of the Holy Spirit. What are the fruits of the Holy Spirit? Love, joy, peace, patience. kindness, goodness, suffering, mildness, faith, modesty, selfcontrol, and chastity. Which of these fruits of the Holy Spirit do you want God to reveal in a special way to you during this New Year?
