From our Pastor


Dear Friends and Parishioners of St. Monica,

This weekend, as we celebrate Mother's Day, our thoughts are drawn to a profound symbol of love: the love a mother has for her child. This love is pure and unconditional; it doesn't ask for anything in return. A mother loves her child simply because of who they are, not for what they can do or provide.

In the Bible, the nature of a mother's love is often compared to God's enduring love for us. Isaiah 66:13 reflects this sentiment so beautifully: "As one whom his mother comforts, so I will comfort you; And you will be comforted in Jerusalem." This passage illustrates how the comforting nature of a mother's love can be a reflection of God's own

compassion and comfort toward us.

Moreover, the love of a mother is not bound by conditions or limits. It transcends the everyday and touches the divine. It's a love that goes beyond the personal and becomes a sacrament of the boundless love of God. In Isaiah 49:15: "Can a woman forget her nursing child and have no compassion on the child of her womb? Even these may forget, but I will not forget you."

Here, the prophet highlights the unlikely possibility of a mother forgetting her child to underscore the unfailing nature of God's memory and care for us.

It is often said that through our mothers, we first experience the concept of unconditional love—a love that expects nothing in return, a hallmark of divine affection. This love is vividly portrayed in the old Jewish proverb, "God could not be everywhere, so He made mothers." Through their love, mothers embody the visible love of the invisible God.

Today, I especially want to acknowledge and thank all the mothers of St. Monica for their exemplary faith and resilient spirit of prayer in our parish community. Your lives are a testament to the strength and grace of maternal love, which sustains and nurtures us all.

May God bless you and every mother on this special day.

- 3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, crayon@ombudsmankc.org, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City- St. Joseph.
- 4. The Diocese has a sincere commitment to providing healing and resources to victims of sexual abuse and their families.
