From our Pastor

Long Live the King!" - The Solemnity of Christ the King

This Sunday we celebrate the grand finale of the Church's liturgical year: the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. It's the Church's way of saying, "Let's end the year with a crown!" Before Advent begins and the baby Jesus returns to the manger, the Church invites us to see who that baby really is—the King of kings and Lord of lords.

Now, "Christ the King" might sound distant to modern ears. After all, we don't live under monarchies anymore. We vote, protest, post memes, and prefer freedom over crowns. We've gotten used to choosing our leaders, not bowing to them. So when the Church says, "Jesus is King," part of us might think, "That's nice... but what does it mean for me on Monday morning?"

Well, it means everything. Because this feast is not about royal robes or golden thrones—it's about who rules our hearts. Everyone serves someone. The only question is: who's on the throne of your life? Is it Christ... or your schedule? Your success? Your comfort? Your smartphone? (Some of us check our phones more than we pray. If there were screen-time confessions, we'd all be in the penalty box!)

Christ's kingship is not like any earthly power. He wears a crown of thorns, not jewels. His throne is a cross, not a palace. His law is love, and His scepter is mercy. He doesn't conquer nations; He conquers hearts. And the weapon He uses is forgiveness. As we hear in today's Gospel, even from the cross, Jesus turns to the criminal beside Him and says, "Today you will be with me in paradise." That's our King the one who reigns by redeeming.

This feast challenges us to ask: Is Christ truly my King or just my weekend consultant? Do I let Him shape my decisions, or do I only check in with Him when things fall apart? To call Jesus "Lord" means surrendering the right to live on our own terms. It means letting Him have the final word in our relationships, our finances, our priorities, and even our grudges. The Kingdom of God isn't built on comfort; it's built on conversion.

And here's the joyful twist; this King doesn't demand servants instead He makes us royal. In baptism, you and I were anointed priest, prophet, and king. Christ shares His crown with us! But we wear it not with pride, but with purpose in order to serve, to forgive, to bring peace. If you want to know whether Christ reigns in your heart, ask yourself: Do I love others as He loves me?

So as we close this liturgical year, remember this isn't the end of something it's the rehearsal for eternity. Christ the King is not waiting for votes, approval ratings, or campaign donations. His reign is everlasting. The only campaign He's running is for your soul.

So today, lift up your heart and shout it like a loyal subject and a joyful disciple: "Viva Cristo Rey!" – Long live Christ the King! And if anyone asks who rules your life this week, you can smile and say, "I serve a King whose kingdom will never end."




