From our Pastor

29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Pray Without Ceasing: The Power of Persistent Faith

This Sunday's Gospel presents one of Jesus' most vivid parables—the story of a persistent widow and an unjust judge. The widow's tireless pleading for justice eventually wears down the judge, who admits that though he neither fears God nor respects man, he will grant her request "lest she finally come and strike me." Jesus tells this story not to compare God to the unjust judge, but to contrast them. If even a corrupt, indifferent man can be moved by persistence, how much more will our loving Father respond to the cries of His children!

Jesus introduces this parable "to show the necessity for them to pray always without becoming weary." Prayer is not an optional act for the believer—it is the lifeline of our faith. Through prayer, we remain rooted in God's presence, attentive to His will, and strengthened for daily trials. It is through prayer that our relationship with God grows from ritual to intimacy, from mere words to deep communion.

Yet, Jesus knows how easily we grow weary. Life often tests our patience and faith—when out prayers seem unanswered, when suffering persists,

when injustice prevails. In those moments, we may wonder: Does God hear me? The parable reminds us that faith is not proven by how quickly prayers are answered but by our steadfastness in praying even when the answer delays.

The widow's perseverance teaches us that authentic faith endures silence. Her persistence springs from deep trust—she believes justice will come, even if not immediately. In the same way, prayer is less about changing God's mind and more about shaping our hearts. Persistent prayer purifies our desires, aligns us with God's timing, and strengthens us to bear what we cannot change.

Jesus' haunting question at the end—"When the Son of Man comes, will He find faith on earth?"—turns the parable inward. Do we still believe in God's goodness when our prayers are delayed? Do we still trust His love when life feels unfair? Faith that endures through silence is the faith that transforms us.

In today's fast-paced culture, where instant results are prized, the call to "pray always" challenges our impatience. True discipleship requires the long obedience of faith—a rhythm of hope that refuses to quit. Persistent prayer is not nagging God but standing firm in relationship with Him, knowing that His justice and mercy never fail.

So, let us be like the widow—unyielding in prayer, confident that God's silence is never His absence. Every prayer we offer—whether whispered in despair, shouted in anger, or spoken in gratitude—is gathered in His heart. And though justice may seem delayed, it will surely come, "speedily," says the Lord, in His perfect time.

May our perseverance in prayer deepen our faith, sustain our hope, and make us witnesses of God's unchanging love in a weary world.


Join Our Choir
