Open Class Showcase Terms and Conditions

Please read this information carefully

1. Exhibitors:

- Must be at least 16 years of age.
- Are not required to be residents of Knox County or surrounding counties.
- Are limited to two entries per Class but may exhibit in an unlimited number of Classes.
- Will request placement in a specific Department/Category/Class with rulings made by the Chairperson of the Open Class Showcase or his/her representative if there is a question.

2. Exhibits:

- Must fit into a Department listed in this booklet and a Category/Class within the Department. Rulings on Department/Category/Class fit will be made by the Department Superintendent or the Open Class Showcase Chairperson.
- Must be handmade, prepared, or grown by the exhibitor with the exception of the Antiques/Vintage Department.
- Must have been **completed within the past two (2) years** (with the exception of the Photography Department which has a one (1) year limitation and the Antiques/Vintage Department where exhibits do not have to be made by the exhibitor).
- Must not have been exhibited previously at the Knox County Fair through the Open Class Showcase.
- Must meet the guidelines of the Department in which they are to be entered.
- Must not contain content or subject matter deemed objectionable.

3. Project Entry Schedule:

- Saturday, July 12, 2025: 9:00 am to 2:00 pm, non-perishables only
- Monday, July 14, 2025: 7:00 am-11:00 am, perishables and nonperishables.
- 4. Entry Fees: \$1.00 per exhibit. Payments must be cash or check.
- . Judging Schedule: Monday, July 14, 2025, from 12:00 pm until finished.
- Placing: All exhibitor information will be withheld from the judges.
- ▶ Each class with a minimum of three (3) entries will have a 1st, 2nd, and 3rd placing. Classes with less than three (3) entries may be combined with other Classes under the same Category and judged as one Class. Combining Classes will be done at the discretion of the Department Superintendent or Open Class Showcase Chairperson and will be completed prior to judging. No 1st or 2nd place ribbons will be awarded automatically to Classes with less than three (3) entries as items will be judged on their own merit. No "Exhibitor" or "Honorable Mention" ribbons will be awarded.
- Each 1st place in a Class will be considered for the Category champion and reserve champion placing if there is a minimum of two (2) 1st place exhibits in the Category.
- Each champion placing in a Category will be considered for the Department Grand Champion and Reserve Champion if there is a minimum of two (2) champion Category placings.
- Rulings on Department/Category/Class placement will be made by the Department Superintendent or the Open Class Showcase Chairperson.
- The judge in a Department will have the final decision on the placing of an entry.

- 7. Judging: Depending on the Department and Category, exhibits will be judged with the following qualities in mind: workmanship, use of multiple skills, preparation, cleanliness, taste (culinary aris), suitability of purpose, color combination, beauty, presentation, and originality. Entries in the Antiques/Vintage Department may also be judged based on the rarity/uniqueness of an item. The Sewing Department page includes factors for judging difficulty level of sewing entries. Judges reserve the right to place entries on factors they consider important/necessary to the specific category in which they are judging.
- 8. Premiums: No premiums will be issued for placings.
- Separate categories for professional and amateur exhibitors. A professional photography, arts, or crafts photographer, artist, or craftsman is one who is in the photography, arts, or crafts teaching profession or doing extensive exhibiting or selling of his/her work. A professional photographer, artist, or craftsman may have a business card, website, or Facebook page to promote his/her work. A professional photographer, artist, or craftsman for work must be original, not made from a kit or copied from someone else's work. Once a photographer, artist, or craftsman has exhibited as a professional in a specific category, the photographer, artist, or craftsman may not return to that category as an amateur. Please see the Fine Arts and Photography Department pages for additional information.
- 10. Safety/Security: Every precaution will be taken to ensure the safety and security of the exhibits; however, in no case will the Knox County Fair Board or the Open Class Showcase be held responsible for the loss or damage of any exhibit.
- 11. Pictures: The Open Class Showcase reserves the right to take and use pictures of exhibits for current and future publicity of the Open Class Showcase or the Knox County Fair. Those exhibitors who receive **Grand Champion Ribbons** will be given the opportunity to have their picture taken by the professional photographer that is covering the Knox County Fair. Pictures will be posted on Facebook sites and the Knox County Fair website. The Open Class Showcase cannot guarantee that pictures will be published in any local newspaper.

- 12. Hours of Building Operations: The Open Class Showcase in the C. James McCormick Event Center will plan to follow the open hours of the 4-H Building. Hours of operation will be dependent upon the ability to provide adequate staffing. The Open Class Showcase will be open beginning at 6:00 pm on Monday, July 14, 2025, and will follow the schedule indicated on Page 3 of this Exhibitor Information Booklet. Hours of operation also will be posted on the door of the C. James McCormick Event Center and the Open Class Showcase Facebook page.
- 13. Release of Exhibits: Exhibits will be released from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm on Saturday, July 19, 2025, and from 1:30 pm to 4:00 pm on Sunday, July 20, 2025.
- The Open Class Showcase has the right to dispose of all perishables, no later than 4:00 pm on Sunday, July 20, 2025.

- All exhibits/ribbons not picked up at these times will be held in the Knox County Fair Office until July 23, 2025. If an exhibitor is unable to pick up his/her exhibits/ribbons during the designated time periods, he/she must make arrangements with the Open Class Showcase Chairperson prior to 4:00 pm on Sunday, July 20, 2025. Exhibits/ribbons not picked up by September 30, 2025, will be returned to the Open Class Showcase inventory.
- Exhibitors who wish to do so may recycle their ribbons for future use. Boxes will be available to do so during the release of exhibits time periods.

All decisions concerning **Categories** and **Classes** will be made by the Department Superintendent or the Open Class Showcase Chairperson.

Antiques/Vintage

Terms and Conditions

- Entries must be 50 years of age or older.
- Items should be clean and in good condition.
- Dimensions of the exhibit can be no larger than 30" square or 12" in depth and the weight must be less than 20 pounds.
- Exhibitors are limited to two (2) entries per Class; however, exhibitors may enter items in an unlimited number of Classes.





- Exhibitors may be Professional (P) or Amateur (A) artists and must designate which category they wish to be in at the time of entry.
- Exhibits must be the **original work** of the exhibitor (i.e., no items made from kits, replicas of other work (i.e., photographs not taken by the exhibitor), or during instructor-led demonstration classes). Exhibitors may use images they have created themselves as a reference (i.e., photographs they have taken), however, images from the Internet or other media must not be copied but may be used as a reference and enhanced with the exhibitor's work. A small picture or copy of the original referenced work should be attached to the exhibitor's work so that enhancements can be determined.
- All pictures must have a stiff backing and be ready to hang with wire fasteners.

- Flowers in "Arrangement" categories may be purchased (as opposed to grown) by the exhibitor but must be arranged by the exhibitor.
- Exhibitors should replace flowers during the week to keep fresh if possible.

Category A-D entries must:

- Be canned by the exhibitor since July 2022.
- Be exhibited in one (1) quart or one (1) pint size standard colorless glass canning jars or jelly jars. There should be no decorations on the container.
- Indicate the product name and date of processing on a label or the entry card
- disqualified. Be sealed with two (2) piece standard canning lids. Unsealed jars will be
- Have canning jar rings with no added ornamentations.

Category E (Honey) entries must:

- Be produced by the exhibitor since July 2022.
- Be exhibited in a one (1) pint size colorless glass jar/container or clear plastic jar/container.
- Indicate the product name and date of processing on a label or the entry card
- Be sealed. Unsealed jars/containers will be disqualified.
- Have no added ornamentations on the jar or container.




