- DRIED: BEANS (ANY, 41BS+), RICE (41BS+), BOUILLON (CHICKEN, BEEF VEGGIES, 16OZ+), MASECA, ALL PURPOSE FLOUR, IODIZED SALT, SUGAR, INSTANT/QUICK OATMEAL, INSTANT COFFEE, CINNAMON STICKS, CHILE (GUAJILLO, ARBOL, JAPONES, ROJO), AMARILLO), PASTA (ELBOW, SHORT ANGEL, RAMEN)
- OTHER: COOKING OIL (VEGETABLE, CORN, OLIVE), PEANUT BUTTER, JELLY, SLICED BREAD, ORANGES, POTATOES
