

**Rural Municipality of St. Peter No. 369**

**Bylaw No. 7, 2025**

**A BYLAW OF THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF ST. PETER NO. 369 FOR THE PURPOSE TO  
REGULATE THE SPEED OF CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLES.**

WHEREAS the Council of the Rural Municipality of St. Peter No. 369 in the Province of Saskatchewan wishes to enact a bylaw to regulate the speed of motor vehicles 20 tonnes and over on public roadways within the Rural Municipality.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Rural Municipality of St. Peter No. 369, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts the following:

**1. Short Title**

This Bylaw may be referred to as Reduced Speed Bylaw.

**2. Purpose and Intent**

This Bylaw is intended to:

- a) Identify all public roadways within the Rural Municipality of St. Peter No. 369 where reduced speed limits apply to motor vehicles with a gross vehicle weight of **20 tonnes or more**; and
- b) Establish penalties and/or fines for any person operating such vehicles who exceeds the posted speed limits on these designated roadways.

**3. Definitions**

In this Bylaw:

- a) "Roadway" means any public roadway within the Municipality under the direction, control and management of the Municipality;
- b) "Motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle as defined by or pursuant to *The Traffic Safety Act*.

**4. Provisions**

- a) No person shall operate a motor vehicle at a speed greater than which is posted on any roadway.
- b) The maximum speed on all roadways with the Rural Municipality of St. Peter No. 369 shall not exceed 80km/hr with the exception of those roadways which are identified in the attached schedule A, which forms part of this Bylaw, in which motor vehicles 20 tonnes and over will be restricted to a maximum speed of 60 km/hr and these roadways shall be posted as such at the beginning and end of the restriction.
- c) No person shall deface, injure, destroy or remove any speed limit sign or marker erected in accordance with the provisions of this Bylaw.

**5. Enforcement**

- a) A person who contravenes any provisions of this Bylaw is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a penalty of that identified in *The Highway and Transportation Act, 1997*.
- b) Enforcement of this Bylaw may be made by a Bylaw Enforcement Officer and/or Peace Officer duly appointed for the enforcement of Municipal Bylaws through a resolution of Council.


