## NSW Tourism Association welcomes investment to ensure Western Sydney International Airport's success

The NSW Tourism Association welcomes the NSW Government's \$8 million **Western Sydney International Take-Off Fund**, which will help attract international airlines to Western Sydney International Airport (WSI) and strengthen aviation capacity from its opening in 2026. With the fund matched by WSI, this \$16 million investment will play a vital role in boosting visitor numbers, driving tourism expenditure, and ensuring the airport's long-term success.

Western Sydney International Airport is set to be a game-changer for the visitor economy, creating new pathways for international visitors to explore New South Wales. By increasing aviation connectivity, this initiative will provide more choice for travellers and deliver significant economic benefits to communities across the state.

Administered by Destination NSW, the fund will help secure airline commitments, ensuring WSI is positioned as a key global gateway from day one. The NSW Tourism Association strongly supports this investment, which aligns with broader efforts to grow the state's visitor economy to \$91 billion by 2035.

In addition to this welcome investment, the NSW Tourism Association encourages the establishment of an **Open Aviation Attraction Fund** that all NSW airports, with international connectivity, can access. Expanding aviation connectivity beyond WSI will further strengthen the visitor economy by ensuring airports across the state have the support needed to attract new routes and carriers.
