## Guest Speaker

### Ronald C. Todd II

Ronald C. Todd II currently serves as the Chief of Social Impact and Opportunity for Ohio Department of Development. Ronald is a strategic leader dedicated to driving positive social change and fostering opportunities for growth and development within the State of Ohio. He works to inspire and connect diverse Ohioans to a government that works for them by creating a platform to voice their concerns.

Before his appointment, as the Chief of Social Impact and Opportunity for Ohio Department of Development, Ronald was the Minority Affairs Liaison for the Office of Ohio Governor Mike DeWine. Also, Ronald served as the Senior Advisor/Consultant in the Ohio Secretary of State's Office under then Ohio Secretary of State Jon Husted where he advised the Secretary of State's Office on all matters of importance to Ohio's minority communities.

Ronald was a third-generation entrepreneur (independent insurance broker, professional speaker, consultant, and Certified NFL Players Association Contract Advisor). He is a decedent of coalminers in West Virginia. He grew up in the inner-city of Dayton, Ohio where he was a First Team All-City High School football player at Belmont High School. His efforts earned himself a football scholarship to Bowling Green State University and Ronald earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Administration with a Concentration in Management from Ohio Dominican University (Columbus, Ohio). Ronald also completed the University of South Florida Muma College of Business Diversity, Equity and Inclusion in the Workplace Certificate.

He worked with athletes as an advisor early in his professional career. Ronald was a Certified NFL Players Association Contract Advisor for 16 years. He helped NFL players' livelihood by protecting their assets and securing the best benefits



possible. Ronald emphasized the importance of faith, education, and character. Ronald was at one time the youngest (27 years old) African American to negotiate a First Round Draft Pick (Hugh Douglas, Central State University, 16th Pick, 1995 Draft, of the NY Jets).

Ronald has been a keynote speaker for various organizations throughout the country. He has served as a panelist at the Congressional Black Caucus and the National Press Club in Washington, D.C.

Ronald is very active in his community. He is a proud member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., Zeta Delta Lambda Chapter (Springfield, Ohio). Ronald is a Governor Appointed Commissioner to the Ohio Fatherhood Commission, Governor's staff representative for New African Immigrant Commission, member of the JobsOhio Black Founders Advisory Council and the Ohio Supreme Court Reentry Task Force. Previously Ronald was the President of the Southwest Ohio-Northern Kentucky National African Insurance Association, Advisory Board Member for Cincinnati Urban League, Board of Directors for the Center for Business & Consumer Ethics (Dayton Business Bureau), and Board Member of the African American Community Fund (Dayton Foundation).

He is solemnly and publicly Affirmed and Ordained as an Elder in the Full Gospel Baptist Church Fellowship International and an Ordained Elder by the Order of Inspirational Bible Church-City of Destiny (Cincinnati, Ohio). Ronald is a Candidate for the Sacred Office of Bishop Ordinary for the Fellowship of Christian Churches United in Service.

Ronald was honored in 2013 as Top 10 African American Males of Dayton, Ohio, listed as a leader in Who's Who Black Cincinnati/Dayton, Cleveland and Columbus, and Success Guide (Cincinnati/Dayton),

He is married to the lovely Janice S. Todd and has one daughter, Kendall S. Curtis.
