Guest Speaker Shenise Turner-Sloss

Shenise Turner-Sloss is a wife, mother of three, and Dayton native. She's a proud graduate of Dayton Public Schools and went on to earn a BA in Political Science from Fisk University (Nashville, TN) and an M.S. in Administration from Central Michigan University (Mt. Pleasant, MI).

Commissioner Turner-Sloss has more than a decade of experience in local and federal government logistics, community development, and program management. As a former City of

Dayton employee, she provided technical assistance in administering the U.S. Dept. of Housing and Urban Development federal funding programs, the Community Development Block Grant, the HOME Investment Partnership Program, and the Neighborhood Stabilization Program. She has also earned certification in Life-Cycle Logistics, and is a Housing Development Finance Professional. Turner-Sloss is currently a Logistics Management Specialist at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base where she is a proud member of the AFGE Local 1138. She is the only sitting Commissioner who is a current union member.

Commissioner Turner-Sloss is a graduate of Parity, Inc. Leadership Training and the Dayton Urban League Young Professionals and a member of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., the American Federation of Government Employees (AFGE) - Local 1138, Our Revolution, Higher Heights, Matriots, and the Working Families Party. She also serves as a board member Neighborhoods Over Politics, a neighborhood redevelopment and economic sustainability organization which she also co-founded.

In 2022, Commissioner Turner-Sloss became only the third Black woman to serve on the Dayton City Commission. While in office her top priorities are improving transparency and public participation at City Hall, and resolving Dayton's housing affordability crisis and the rampant housing code violations that lead to substandard and sometimes dangerous living conditions for many Dayton residents.
