A Message from the Media Ministry

What would you do ...?

If you received an email like this:

U.S. Dept. of Treasury – You are eligible to receive \$1678 in stimulus payments over the next 12 weeks. To apply, please reply to this email.

Sounds enticing, doesn't it. Don't Do It!

Do Not click Reply! Let me tell you why.

This is what's called a Phishing Scam!

Scammers use this method to gain access to and/or download malicious malware to your computer or device.

So, What should I do ...?

What you should do is follow the KYC method & Delete that email.

KYC stands for **Know Your Customer**.

Understand, no government agency is going to have you reply to them via email. They may email you to inform you of something, but they will never have you reply to them or ask for your credentials.

Also, government agencies will ALWAYS contact you via mail.

I took it a step further to review where the email was coming from & found that it was coming from a "@usa.com" email domain and the Reply to email domain was "@email.com". Red Flags all over the place!

So, in conclusion, if you don't know the customer, don't click Reply. Remember, if it doesn't make sense, stay on the defense and use your common sense!
