the following ordinances were made and adopted;

The City Council of the City Of Drakesboro do ordain as follows:-

Section 1 Fornication or Adultery

That every person who shall commit fornication or adultery in the city limits shall for each offense upon conviction be fined not less than twenty dollars nor more than fifty dollars.

Fornication

Section 2. Work on Sunday Forbidden

That no work or business shall be done on the Sabbath day except the ordinary household affairs or other work of necessity or charity and work on railroads.

If any person on the Sabbath Day shall be found at his own or at any other trade on ~~work~~ calling or shall employ his apprentices, on other persons, in labor or business, whether the same be for profit or amusement unless it be such as permitted herein, he shall be fined not less than two dollars nor more than fifty dollars for each offense. Every person or apprentice so employed shall be deemed a separate offense. Provided, that persons who are members of a religious Society who observe as a Sabbath any other day in the Week than Sunday shall not be liable to the penalty prescribed in this section, if they observe as a Sabbath one day in each ~~week~~ seven as provided herein.

Section 3. Barbering on Sunday

That any person who shall engage in the business of barbering on Sunday shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than five Dollars; upon a second conviction for a like offense shall be fined not less than ten dollars nor more than twenty-five dollars, or imprisoned in the town jail not less than five days nor more than ten days, or both so fined and imprisoned of the discretion of the court.

Section 4. Refusing to obey Summons

That if any person when legally summoned by a sheriff or other officer to assist him in the execution of his office shall fail or refuse to do so he shall be fined fifteen dollars, unless he can give a good reason for his failure on refusal to do so.

Section 5. Selling Cigarettes to minor.

That it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or furnish to any other person under eighteen years of age, any cigarette or cigarette material; or to give, sell, seal, or barter the same to any person whomsoever with the knowledge that the same is to be given as sold or bartered to any such child, or to persuade, advise, counsel or compel any child under said age to smoke same.

Any person who violates the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction ~~thereof~~ therefor shall be fined not less than five dollars and not more than twenty five dollars or imprisoned not exceeding thirty days or both so fined and imprisoned.

Section 6. Unlawful for Minor to smoke Cigarette

That it shall be unlawful for any person under the age of eighteen years to smoke or to have about his person any cigarette or cigarette papers, or in any other way to be furnished with smoking tobacco for cigarette. Any person violating this ordinance shall be fined not less than five dollars nor more than ten dollars.

Provided, the court trying the case may remit the penalty for v
violation of this ordinance upon the disclosure by the person
charged with the offense upon his disclosing the name of the
person or firm or incorporation from whom he obtained such cig-
arette or cigarette papers.

Section 7. Unlawful, to smoke cigarettes at School

Every person who shall smoke or use a cigarette or cigarette
in any ~~way~~ school building or such part thereof as may be used
for school purposes, or upon any school grounds while children
are assembled there for lawful purpose shall be guilty of a
misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished for such offense
by a fine of not less than one dollar nor more than five dollars.

Section 8 Duty of Peace officers regarding Cigarettes

That it shall be the duty of the police officers of the
town of Drakesboro when they or he shall find any person under
the age of eighteen years smoking a cigarette or having in his
possession a cigarette or cigarette papers to immediately inquire
of such person where and of whom he obtained such cigarette or
cigarette papers and upon the failure of such person to give
information when requested to do so by the officers, the officers
shall arrest such person and take him before the police judge of
the town to be dealt with according to law.

Upon information of such person to said judge of the viol-
ation of any cigarette law he shall summons witnesses before
him to ascertain if any law has been violated and shall deal
with such person according to law as provided by these ordinances.

Section 9 Breach of peace

That if any person or persons shall be guilty of breach of
the peace, riot, route, affray or unlawful assembly, the person or
persons so offending and each of these shall be fined not less
than one cent nor more than One Hundred Dollars or imprisoned
in the town jail not less than five days nor more than fifty
days, or both so fined and imprisoned at the discretion of the
Judge trying the case.

Section 10 Firing Deadly Weapons, Assault with Deadly Weapons.

That if any person shall draw a deadly weapon upon another
or shall point a deadly weapon at another, or shall hold or flour-
ish a deadly weapon whether same shall be loaded or unloaded, or
use same in any threatening manner or boisterous manner, or shall
on any street or alley of Drakesboro, or at any school assembly
place of public worship, or business or in going to or from any
place of ~~business~~ of public worship in said town fire or disc-
charge, except in self defence of property, a deadly weapon, he
shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction
shall be fined not less than fifty dollars nor more than One
Hundred Dollars or imprisoned not less than ten days nor more
than fifty days, or both fined and imprisoned.

Section 11 Defacing legal Notice

If any person shall take or tear down or deface any legal
notice put up by any officer authorized to make sales of property
under judgment of a court execution attachment or other legal
process, before the time mentioned in the notice for the sale, or
if he or they shall deface, destroy or mutilate any notice of the
town ordinances he shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon
conviction shall be fined not less than five dollars, nor more
than thirty dollars.

Section 12 Disturbing Religious Worship

If any person shall willfully interrupt or disturb a con-
gregation assembled for or engaged in the worship of God, or shall
willfully interrupt or disturb any school, seminary or college
while the students of the same are engaged in their studies or
undergoing a public examination or any assemblage of people meet-
ing for any lawful purpose he shall be fined not less than twenty
dollars nor more than fifty dollars or imprisoned not less than twenty
days or both fined and imprisoned.

Section 13.

24 Any person who shall willfully make an indecent exposure of his person or who shall talk in a loud boisterous manner within the city limits shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than five nor more than thirty dollars.

Section 14 Interferring with anothers business

If any person shall interfere with anothers business while in lawful persuit of his business ,recreation or pleasure in the city limits without lawful persuit thereof shall be fined not l less than thirty dollars for each offense. ↖

Section 15. Women of Ill Fame

It shall be unlawful for any woman of ill fame to loiter upon the streets,alleys,or public places within the city limits or to conduct herself in such a way as to amount to advertising herself. Anyone violating this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction be fined not less than five dollars nor more than thirty dollars.

Section 16 Driving on Side Walk

It shall be unlawful for any person to drive any vehicle upon any side walk,or to rade any animal upon such side walk,or to ride or drive any horse,mule or others animals at a run or gallop on the streets or alleys of the town od Drakesboro. Any person guilty of any such offenses shall upon conviction be fined not less than ten nor more than twenty dollars foreach offense.

Section 17 Profane Swearing

If any person shall profanely swear or curse in the city limits he shall be fined one dollar for each offense;and each oath shall be deemed a separate offense. If the offense is committed in the presence of the police Judge,the Judge may instantly without further proof inflict the penalty. Swearing

Section 18 Dogfighting or Chicken-fighting

If any person shall for profit cause dogs or chicken cocks to engage in fighting,or shall keep any house or place to be used for dog-fighting or chicken-fighting,or shall bet upon any dog or chicken-fight,or engage therein,or furnish any dog or chicken cock to be used in a dog or chicken fight he shall be fined not less than ten dollars nor more than One Hundred dollars for each offense.

Section 19 Mistreating Anamel

If any person within the city limits unnecessarily or cruelly beat,torture,use ot otherwise mistreat any anamel,whether his own or not shall upon conviction be fined not exceeding One Hundred Dollars.

Section 20 Proud Slut

Any ownernof a proud slut or bitch who allow her to run at large in the city limits while in such condition or in heat shall be fined One Dollar forceach day she is permitted to run at large while in that condition.

Section 21 Exhibiting Stud,Jack,or Bull

If any person shall exhibit or show by riding or leading a stud horse,Jack or Bull or use him in covering within veiw or hearing of any place of Public religious Worship during the time that an assemblage of person are engaged in such wershhip or ass-embled for that purpose,or disfuersing therefrom,he shall be fined not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars; or if he shall use such horse,Jack or Bull coveringwithin view of any private residence,school-house or seminary in the City limits, he shall be fined not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars.

Section 22 Hitching to Shade Trees

It shall be unlawful for any person to hitch a horse, mule or other animals to a shade tree in the city limits, any one so offending shall be fined not less than two nor more than five dollars.

Section 23 Provoking Assault

That whosoever in the presence of another person, or persons use any abusive or insulting language intending thereby to insult such other person, or persons, or with intention to provoke any assault shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall upon conviction be fined not exceeding twenty five dollars. If the offender be a male and the person so injured be a female the offender shall be fined any sum not exceeding fifty dollars.

Section 24 Selling Poison to Minor

If any person shall sell or deliver to any person under the age of fifteen years without the consent of his parents or guardian or upon the written prescription of a physician, any poisonous drug or medicine he shall be fined One Hundred Dollars.

Section 25 Removal of Carcass

It shall be the duty of the owner of any animal which shall die in the corporate limits of Drakesboro to remove and dispose same by burying or burning as required by law. If such owner or person having custody of such dead animal shall fail after notice to dispose of the carcass as above set out he shall be fined One Dollar for each day he so fails.

Section 26. Allowing Minor to Play Pool

If any one being the owner of the tables called Pigeon-hole tables or any tables similar thereto, or any billiard, or pool-tables shall knowingly suffer or permit for compensation or reward any minor under the age of twenty-one years without the written permit of the parent or guardian of said minor, or other person having the care, custody or control of said minor to play any game thereon either by betting, or not betting, or shall, knowingly suffer or permit any person to bet upon any game played every person so offending shall be fined One Hundred Dollars for each offense and shall forfeit the right and privilege of again keeping such table.

Section 27 Loitering Forbidden

It shall be unlawful for any person to loiter upon the premises of another without the permission of the owner or tenant. Any person violating this ordinance shall be fined not less than five nor more than thirty dollars.

Section 28 Gaming -- Penalty

If any person are persons shall engage in any hazard or game of chance on which money or property is won or lost by betting thereon. Such person shall be fined not less than twenty dollars nor more than One Hundred dollars for each offense.

Section 29 Betting on Pool -- Penalty

If any person licensed to keep a billiard table, pigeon-hole table or pool table shall knowingly allow or permit any betting on the game played on such table he shall be fined not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars for each offense and shall forfeit his license; any person who shall bet on any such game shall be fined not less than twenty dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars for each offense.

Section 30 Vagrants --- Punishment

Any person found guilty of the offense of vagrancy in the city limits shall for the first offense be fined ten dollars or imprisoned in the work house, if there be one, for thirty days or imprisoned in the town jail thirty days or the punishment may be both fine and imprisonment.

For the Second offense and all subsequent offenses the punishment shall be imprisonment in the work-house, or town jail sixty days. Any one who shall be fined under this act shall be required to work at hard labor at one dollar per day until his term of imprisonment shall expire.

Section 31 Peace officer to arrest vagrant

It shall be the duty of the marshall or any peace officer of the city to keep watch at the places where vagrants are accustomed to congregate, and if any of the officers has reason to believe that a vagrant habitually infests a public place or street it shall be the duty of such to warn him to leave such place or go to work. If two or more vagrants habitually loiter about any street or public place, it shall be the duty of such officer to disperse them.

Section 32 Auctioneers-

It shall be unlawful for any person to act as auctioneer in the sale of property at public auction in the city limits without first obtaining a license from the city clerk.

Any person who violates this ordinance shall be fined not less than five dollars nor more than twenty dollars.

Section 33 Peddling Forbidden ---Penalty

All persons who shall under cover of Bona Fide merchants come in or take up a temporary residence in the City of Drakesboro for the purpose of disposing of any goods, wares or merchandise, either at auction or otherwise except as herein specifically provided, shall be deemed peddlers and it shall be unlawful for any peddler to sell or otherwise dispose of his goods, wares and merchandise without first obtaining a license therefrom from the City Clerk.--

Any person or persons who shall violate or attempt to violate this ordinance shall be fined not less than twenty dollars nor more than fifty dollars.

No person shall be deemed peddler under this ordinance who shall sell tinware, agricultural implements, sewing machines, portable mills, books, pamphlets, paper, meat, stoneware, or farm or garden products nor merchants nor their agents by selling by sample but it ever at persons selling agricultural implements are not exempt from paying license under this ordinance.

Section 34 Privies required to be kept clean.

That it shall be the duty of each any every land-lord or tenant in the city to clean and disinfect the privy or closets used on the premises once in each week or oftener if necessary and to bury or burn the fifth and affscourings and use lime or either didinfectant in such quantities and as often as may be necessary to keep such privies in clean and sanitary condition at all times.

The school board is hereby required to keep the privies used and the school grounds in sanitary conditions.

Any person or persons failing or refusing to comply with this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than one dollar for each day he or she neglects to do so. It shall be the duty of the marshall of the said to see that this ordinance is complied with.

Section 35 Garbage and Refuse --Penalty

It shall be unlawful for any person to allow the accumulation of garbage -- such as dishwater, slops, decaying vegetables, and vegetable matter and other filth to accumulate in cans or sinks, or to allow same to lie exposed to flies and produce offense smell and stinch on or about the or occupied by them in the City Limits.

Any person so offending shall be fined Or day such condition is allowed to exist.

Section 35 Hogs- Space Required -- Penalty

It shall be unlawful for any person between the 1st. day of March and the 1st. day of November of each year to keep any hog or hogs in the City Limits, unless they are confined in pens or pounds so as to furnish at least 400 square feet of space for each hog.

Any person who shall fail to comply with this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined one dollar for each day such condition is allowed. If any hog pen shall be allowed to become in a filthy or uncleanly condition it is declared to be a nuisance and may be proceeded against as such.

Section 36 License Plates required on Motors-

The owner of each motor vehicle who shall operate same upon the streets of Drakesboro shall have a number corresponding with the number of the certificate of registration issued by the secretary of state as provided by the law, conspicuously displayed on the front of such vehicle owned or operated by him, to be not more than four feet nor less than eighteen inches from the ground and to be kept free from grease and dirt and readable at all times whenever same shall be driven upon the streets of said town.

Said numbers to be separate Arabic Numerals not less than four inches in height and each stroke of not less than one half inch and also a part of said number the letters "KY" not less than One inch in height and the year of registration across the right hand end of such plate in convenient size.

If any person shall violate this ordinance he shall be fined not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars.

Section 37 Manufacturing Liquor -- Penalty.

That it shall be unlawful to manufacture, sell, barter, give away, or keep for sale, have in his possession, or transport, vinous, malt or intoxicating liquors except for sacramental, medicine purposes in the town of Drakesboro.

Section 38

No person, persons, Company or corporation, shall possess or have in possession any spirituous, vinous, or malt liquors unless same have been lawfully acquired and intended to be used lawfully. Any person or corporation so offending shall be fined not less than One hundred dollars nor more than Three Hundred Dollars and, if any person, confined in town jail not less than thirty days nor more than sixty days; and in any suit, prosecution or action concerning same the burden of proving same to be lawfully acquired and to be lawfully used shall be upon the defendant.

Section 39 Transporting Liquor

That when any peace officer of the City of Drakesboro shall discover any person in the act of illegally passing or transporting in violation to this ordinance intoxicating liquors in any wagon, buggy, automobile or other vehicle it shall be the duty to seize at once any and all intoxicating liquors found therein being transported contrary to law, or illegally possessed to seize such wagon, buggy, automobile or other vehicle, team or conveyance and arrest any person in charge thereof. Any person violating this ordinance shall upon conviction be fined not less than One Hundred Dollars nor more than Three Hundred Dollars and confined in the town jail not less than thirty day nor more than sixty days.

The Court upon conviction of the person arrested shall order the liquor destroyed and shall order a sale of the property seized and the officer making the sale after deducting the expense of keeping the property and cost of sale, shall pay all valid liens according to priority which liens shall be established at any hearing thereof as being bonafide but the burden of proving that the property was being used without the consent or approval of the lienor, or owner of the property shall be on defendant.

If however no one shall be found claiming the team, vehicle or other conveyance, or automobile, the seizure of same with a description thereof shall be advertized in some newspaper being in general circulation in the county once a week for two consecutive weeks and by handbills in three public places near the place of seizure and if no claimant shall appear within ten days after the last publication of the advertisement the said property shall be sold at public auction and the proceeds after deducting the expenses and costs shall be paid into the town treasury.

Section 40

Search Warrant

2423 When the affidavit of any Federal, State Police officer or any other reputable Citizen is filed with the Police Judge, of Drakesboro describing the house building or premises as nearly as may be where intoxicating liquors are sold or manufactured or disposed of illegally possessed in violation of law, shall by his warrent cause any house or building or other place or premises to be searched by night or by day for the detection of any intoxicating liquors which are kept there or other disposition in violation of law, or for the detection of any illicit still or aparatus designed for the manufacture of intoxicating liquors or where same is illegally possessed in violation of law and if admission be not given on demand the officer inforing said warrent shall force a entrance into such house, building or other place and seize any intoxicating liquors illicit still or other aparatus designed for the manufacture of liquor and shall arrest the keeper or person in charge of such house, building, or other place where such illicit still or aparatus is found and carry such person or persons before the Judge issuing the warrent to be dealt with according to law. The Officer shall destroy the illicit still or aparatus designed for the manufacture of intoxicating liquors but shall carry the intoxicating liquors before the offiber issuing the warrents.

Any Officer receiving a warrent as herein set out shall proceed to execute same immediarely on the day he receives same and upon failure to do so shall be fined as provided by law, No Search warrent shall be quashed if the same and affidavit on which it is based are regular on their face.

5 If the search warrent is quashed no property taken by virtue thereof shall be ordered to be reurned or restored unless the person fromm whose possession it was taken both alleges and proves that he was in lawful possession of same.

Section 41 Drunkenness -- Penalty

X Any person who shall in any public place or in or upon any vehicle commonly used for transportation of passengers or in or about any depot, platform, waiting station or room in the town od Drakesboro drink any intoxicating liquor of any kind or if any person shall be drunk or intoxicated in any public place or building or at any public place gathering, or if any person shall be drunk or intoxicated and shall disturb the pease of any one he shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars nore more than One Hundred Dollars, or imprisonment in the town jail not less than five days not more than thirty days or both fined and imprisoned.

Section 42 Prescription For Liquor

No prescription shall provide for more than one pint of liquor, nor shall any physician prescribe for more than one pint at any one time not at intervals of not less than than ten days.

If any person shall secure any liquors upon such prescription at intervals of less than ten days he shall be fined not less than fifty dollars nor more than one hundred dollars or imprisoned in the town jail not less than ten days nor more than sixty days or both so fined and imprisoned in the descretion of the Judge or Jury trying the case.

Any driver violating this ordinance shall upon conviction be fined not less than fifty dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars or imprisoned in the town jail not less than ten days nor more than sixty days or both.

Section 43 Delivering Liquor

Any officer, agent or employee of any railroad company, express Company or other carriers who shall knowingly carry or deliver any liquors, the sale of which is forbidden or prohibited by law, to or for any person to be sold, bartered or given away or otherwise furnished in violation to law and any officer, agent, or employee who shall knowingly deliver any such liquor to any person other than the person to whom it is consigned and without a written order in such instant of the consignee thereof shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than fifty dollars nor more than Three Hundred Dollars.

Section 44 Forfeited Bonds-

That if any bond executed for the appearance of any person or persons, before the Police Judge of a Police Court of the City of Drakesboro, upon any charge for violation of any ordinance of law shall be forfeited on account of non-appearance of such person to answer said charge, or if such bond or bonds shall be declared forfeited for any cause, shall inure to the benefit of said town. Such bonds shall be collected according to law and proceeds paid into town treasury. X

Section 45 Playing Baseball on Sunday

That it shall be unlawful to play baseball in the City Limits of Drakesboro on Sunday.

Any person or persons who violates this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Thirty Dollars. It shall be the duty of the town Marshall to see that this ordinance is enforced. X

Section 46 Stock Running At Large --Penalty

It shall be unlawful for any person, the owner, custodian or bailee of such stock to allow any horse, mule, cattle, sheep, goats, or any other stock or cattle to run at large within the City Limits of the town of Drakesboro. Any person violating this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than One Dollar nor more than Five Dollars for each offense; And each day such stock runs at large shall be deemed a separate offense. It shall be the duty of the town marshall of said town to immediately take up any stock found running at large in said town and deliver to the owner of such stock upon his paying the fee for taking it up together with a reasonable charge for feeding and caring for same.

When any stock of any kind as set out herein shall be taken up, it shall be the duty of the town marshall to fine and notify such owner of such fact.

If the Owner, Custodian or bailee of such stock shall refuse or fail to pay then the marshall may hold such stock or cattle in his possession and shall forth with file with the Police Judge, in writing the amount of the charges for taking up and caring for such stock together with complete description of such stock so taken up by him.

It shall be the duty of the Judge to at once issue a summons in Equity for the owner, custodian or bailee of such stock to appear in court five days after the service of same to show cause why such stock or cattle should not be ordered to be sold to pay the charges for taking up feeding and caring for them.

Upon the hearing of the court the court may adjudge that a lien exist upon such stock for all the costs and charges as set out herein and order that the stock be sold to satisfy such debt and the costs of the action and any surplus arising from said sale to be paid to the owner. 86

He may direct the City Marshall to make said sale after posting written or printed notices at at least three public places in the City ten days before sold, stating therein the time and place of sale and shall sell same to the highest bidder and shall sell only a sufficiency of said property to satisfy the debt and costs. He shall be adjudged to sell on a credit of three months and take bond with good security. The bond to draw interest from date.

In case stock is found running at large as herein set out, and no owner can be found the owner may be summoned by warning order and the said property sold there under. Any surplus arising from the sale of such stock may be paid into the town treasury to be turned over to the rightful owner when found.

Section 47 Providing Pound for stock,

That the City Council may and it is hereby made its duty to secure and provide a pound, pen or enclosure wherein to confine and keep stock taken up by the marshall until such stock shall be disposed of as herein provided.

Section 48

That the Marshall shall be allowed a fee of 50 cents for taking up each mule, horse, or head of cattle and 25 cents for each hog, pig, or sheep, goat or shoat.

Section 49 License on Trades

That an annual license be imposed and collected on all and each Trade, Occupation and Profession carried on and Conducted in the City of Drakesboro as set out hereinafter. Any person who fails to comply with this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined one dollar for each day he or she fails to obtain license as set out hereinafter.

Each license provided for herein shall be issued by the City Clerk. No license shall be issued for a longer period than one year, but may be issued for a shorter time. When a license is issued for a less time than a year the charge shall be in proportion as the time bears to the whole year.

The license fee shall be as herein set out opposite the occupation.

The Clerk of the City Board of treasurt shall be allowed to charge and collect 75 cents for each license he shall issue under this ordinance.

Work out a fine

Section 50 Hard Labor Sentence

That when any person shall be sentenced to imprisonment under Judgment of the Police Court in default of payment of fine and cost imposed by said court he may be required to work on the streets or other public works of the city until the fine and costs are satisfied but the period of hard labor for the non-payment of the fine and costs shall not exceed one day for each one dollar of such fine and costs.

Section 51

The City Council of the City of Drakesboro do ordain as follows:

That any Disordly conduct in the City of Drakesboro Kentucky shall be unlawful.

Any person or persons who shall commit any disordlyact or be guilty of any disordly conduct in the said city of Drakesboro shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than One Dollar nor more than Twentyfive dollars for each offense.
