## Telephone patent Day

On this day in 1876, Alexander Bell got a patent for telephone.

Surprisingly, the name Bell comes from Old English **belle** — a **ringing signal that calls attention**.

It was created thanks to many inventors, including Antonio Meucci, Philipp Reis, and Elisha Gray, who even argued over who invented it first!

It works like this: when you speak, your voice makes tiny vibrations in the air. The telephone turns those vibrations into electrical signals, sends them far away, and turns them back into sound. And today, mobile phones send voices as invisible radio waves.
