



International Joke Day

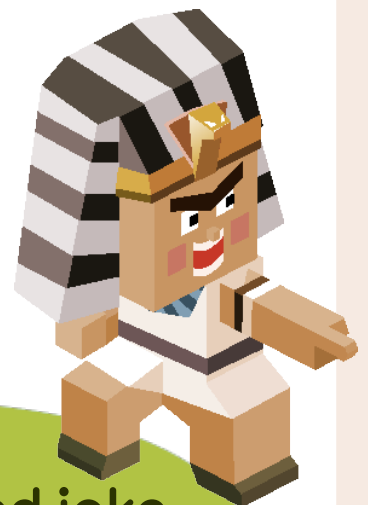
Imagine the world

World UFO Day

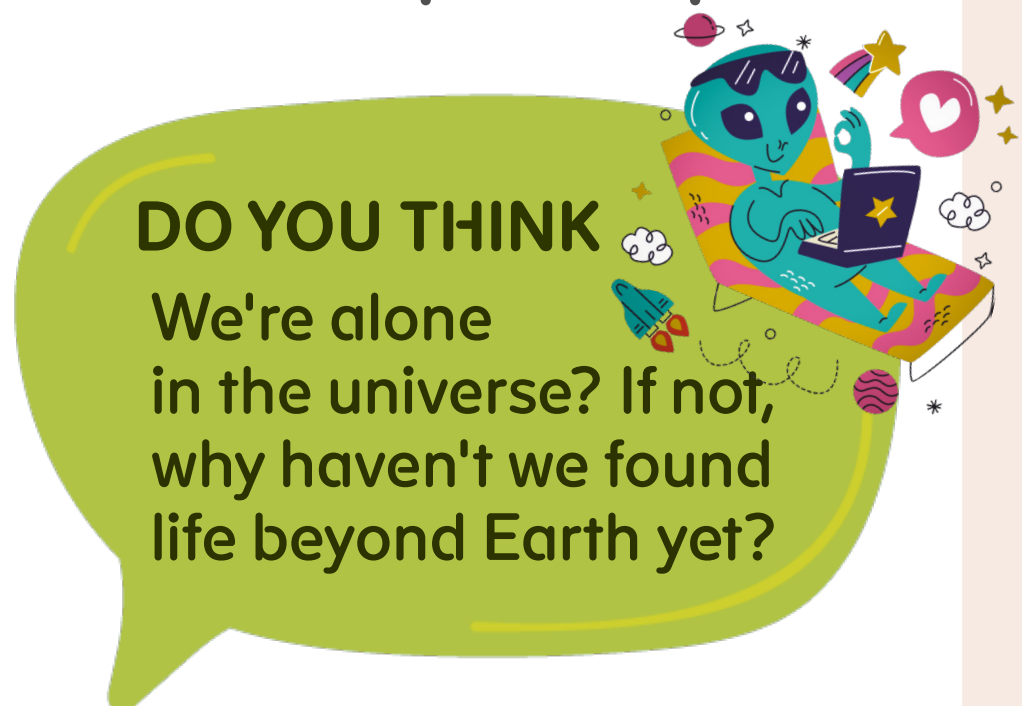
Are we alone in the Universe?

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Mechanical Pencil Day

Before graphite pencils appeared in the 1500s, people from ancient Romans to Leonardo da Vinci used metal styluses sometimes made of lead (poisonous!). Today's mechanical pencil "lead" has no real lead inside just graphite, clay, wax, or polymer binders: a clever mix of engineering, physics, and design.

Why July 5? Because 0.7 mm and 0.5 mm are two popular pencil lead sizes!

No sharpening needed and one lead can write up to 58 km / 36 miles!
