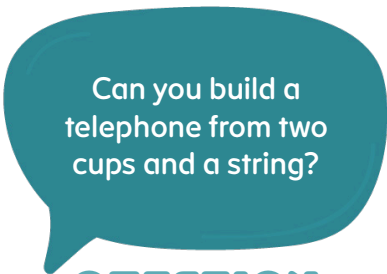


Alexander Graham Bell's Birthday

Surprisingly, the name Bell comes from Old English **belle** — a **ringing signal that calls attention**.

In 1876, Alexander Graham Bell invented the telephone almost by accident. After spilling acid, he called for help and his assistant heard him through a wire. Sound travels as vibrations, not magic.

Telephones turn vibrations into signals and back into sound. Even two cups and a string can carry a voice. Mobile phones send voices as invisible radio waves.

The word "compliment" is connected to the Latin word **comple** meaning "to fill up."
