

✓ Proper Packaging & Labeling Checklist for Trade Show Freight

Use this **quick-reference checklist** to ensure your trade show materials are properly packed, secured, and labeled for **damage-free and hassle-free** delivery.

Crating & Padding for Fragile Items
☐ Use wooden crates for booth structures, electronics, and delicate materials.
☐ Secure foam inserts inside crates to protect fragile components.
☐ Pack smaller fragile items in heavy-duty plastic cases with padding.
☐ Palletize and shrink-wrap boxes for better stability.
<i>Pro Tip:</i> Reusable crates offer long-term savings and better protection for exhibit materials
Securing Freight in the Trailer
☐ Wrap moving blankets around items to prevent scratches and impact damage.

Example 2 Clear & Accurate Labeling

☐ Label every package and crate with:
 Exhibitor Name Booth Number Show Name & Venue Consignee Name & Contact Information
 □ Ensure labels match your shipping documents (BOL, Packing List, etc.). □ Use large, durable labels that won't peel off in transit. □ Place labels on all sides of the crate for easy identification.
Pro Tip: Laminate labels or cover them with clear tape to protect against damage.
⚠ Marking Fragile & Special Handling Items
☐ Attach "FRAGILE" labels to delicate items like screens, glass panels, and electronics. ☐ Use "THIS SIDE UP" arrows to indicate the correct orientation. ☐ Apply "HANDLE WITH CARE" stickers on crates and pallets.
☐ If using custom wooden crates, paint or stencil handling instructions directly on the surface.
Pro Tip: If your items require climate control (e.g., printed graphics, certain electronics), nclude a "KEEP DRY" or "TEMPERATURE SENSITIVE" label.
♯ Final Pre-Shipping Checks
☐ Confirm all items are secured and properly labeled before pickup. ☐ Match shipping documents (BOL, Packing List, etc.) with labeled freight.
☐ Take photos of packed and labeled freight for reference and proof of condition. ☐ Provide the carrier with clear handling instructions .
