The **University of Jérémie (UJ)** is a private higher education institution located in southwestern Haiti. The university was founded to serve the underprivileged population of the Grand’Anse department, and is one of the only universities in this remote department of the country. UJ is comprised of four colleges that offer Bachelor degrees: nursing, agriculture, business administration, and theology. In Haiti this education presents a pathway for graduates to secure higher paying jobs, pursue graduate studies, and serve leadership roles in their communities. The university also provides vocational training to the larger community of Jérémie through short courses.

The College of Nursing provides theoretical instruction and practical training through a teaching clinic on-site. The college partners with health care providers in the region to place students in residencies as part of their program of study. There are currently 65 students enrolled in the program. The College of Nursing urgently needs medical and nursing textbooks, references, and visual aids to support their classroom instruction and clinical services. Materials sent to Winter Haven, FL will be sent onwards to the University of Jérémie as part of a planned container shipment in June 2021.

This program is designed to assist developing countries to improve their agricultural education, research, and extension programs through exchanges with U.S. universities. The cohort of African veterinary professors will spend the fall 2021 semester under the guidance of a faculty mentor at the UT Knoxville campus. They will participate in coursework, research activities, and field visits during the exchange.

The UT College of Veterinary Medicine is requesting veterinary textbooks and references to send with these professors when they return to their home institutions in Ghana, Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania, and Ethiopia. The Faculty Exchange Program will pay for additional checked luggage for the participants return travel.
